It's hard to call the beginning of my faith journey a "conversion." I was eight years old, raised in the church by Christian parents. Yet I was struck by the stark realities of life and death staring into my grandmother's casket. I found myself alone one evening watching television. It was a televised Billy Graham crusade and I was mesmerized. As Reverend Graham spoke from John 3:16, my eight-year-old soul was moved to respond. I wanted eternal life! My father and I knelt by our gold couch in the family room, and I invited Jesus into my heart.

I believe with all my heart that Jesus pursued me and sent people into my life to show me the way to salvation. Some of us are Timothy's like me — raised in the church with perhaps no specific date and time when we "accepted" Christ. We were nurtured in the church and grew up and into faith. Others, like we'll discover this Sunday, are Saul/Paul's, rebellious toward God and pursuing our own selfish purposes until one day, confronted by our sin and need for salvation, turn by faith to Christ as an adult. Sometimes these conversion stories are dramatic accounts of leaving the old life and turning to follow the Jesus way.

We're going to discover some people this Sunday in Acts 8-9 who have different responses to the Gospel message of good news in Jesus. It we be an opportunity for all of us to revisit our conversion stories, and whether our hearts remain soft to the tender leading of God's Spirit to follow Jesus, no matter the cost.





## **September 2025 Session Meetings Highlights**

The Deacons presented "Decluttering Strategies" on September 23 with 17 in attendance. Thanks to Anya Fontes & Allison Gray for coordinating and presenting the event. The Deacons have purchased new crosses for new member bags and ordered Thanksgiving cards. Marketing for the December 7 Service of Solace will be placed in a Sun City magazine "SCS Life."

Pastor David reported on the Fuller Theological Retreat with Jeff Holck on September 19-20, focusing on forgiveness and reconciliation. There will be one more retreat to be scheduled next year. The fall sermon series on the Book of Acts is underway with Men's and Women's Bible studies, Young Adults, Youth and Sunday School simultaneously studying the Book of Acts. The staff will have annual reviews with Pastor David October 7. Long time member Deloras Singleton is in Sky Canyon Rehab facility. Pledge Sunday and November communion will be on November 9. The annual Church Picnic will be on October 19 following the 2<sup>nd</sup> service.

The Magnify Commission (matters relating to worship) reported that the choirs from Grace Presbyterian and MVPC are working on a joint presentation of Handel's "Messiah" to be presented to each congregation in December.

The Serve Commission (serving others outside of MVPC) reported on Holiday Giving Opportunities: 150 Thanksgiving Boxes for Olive Crest to be distributed to the congregation either October 12 or 19 for delivery by November 2; Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes collection for Samaritan's Purse to be announced; Salvation Army Angel Tree donations hopefully to be reinitiated. Dementia Support group monthly meetings are going well according to Paula Anderson, coordinator. Pet Ministry will host a Pet Blessing during the church picnic on October 19; forty pet homeless bags have been prepared; newspaper collection continues for the Poppy Foundation Cat Rescue. The Commission is planning a Denim Drive for Project 150 on October 26 focusing on new and old jeans for teens. The Project 150 14<sup>th</sup> Annual Fall Celebration will be held on October 2, 2025 with Gary Wall and Peg Albrecht, MVPC Project 150 volunteer, planning to attend the event. The Family Promise \$14 million Navigation Center grand opening and open house will be Tuesday, September 30. Salvation Army monthly donations for September valued at approximately \$2000 and September Men's Breakfast donations to Westminster Food Bank totaling \$710. "Protecting Our Children," promoting responsible gun ownership in order to reduce child gun deaths, is scheduled for October 5, with Anne Lawton and Paul Tomlinson as presenters and content based on the Be SMART for Kids campaign.

The Nurture Commission (taking care of our congregation) reported that Children, Youth, and Young Adults are all studying the Book of Acts in tandem with Pastor David's sermon series.

The Gather Commission (taking care of gathering in large and small groups) noted that a 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday brunch on August 31 was a great success with a special thanks to Gary Wall for cooking. Football Sunday on September 21 was also a huge hit.

Stewardship Commission (being good managers of time, talents, and treasures). Elder John Meola reported that the kitchen's reverse osmosis system has been replaced. The elevator failed a safety inspection due to electrical issues and repairs will be made. The solar power system panels are being cleaned to assure full potential power generation. LED lights will replace current parking structure lights to brighten up parking areas.

Pastor David and Elders Laura Martin, Karla Canfield and Chris Kirschman reported on the fall Presbytery meeting September 9-10 at Zephyr Cove Conference Center, Lake Tahoe.



#### What Does the Bible Say?

#### **Tame Your Thoughts**


Three Tools to Renew Your Mind and Transform Your Life by Max Lucado: Have you been feeling weighed down by worry? Or caught up in a web of self-critical thoughts? The good news is that with God's help, you can learn to renew your mind, break free from negative patterns, and become a little more like Jesus every day. This six-session Bible study explores three Scripture-based tools for managing your thoughts:

- Practice Picky Thinking: Monitor the airspace of your thoughts and don't allow the destructive ones to land.
- Identify UFOs: Scan for any untruths that are creating false narratives that are leading to overreactions.
- Uproot and Replant: Don't let the ugly weeds of Satan's lies grow. Pull them up by the roots and replace them with God's truth.

These three tools will help you take every thought captive and test the messages that replay in your mind against the truth of God's Word. You will also learn to overcome common thought traps like anxiety, guilt, rejection, dissatisfaction, and more. No matter who you are or where you come from, progress is possible.


#### Peter (Youth)




