OUT (John 4:1-43)

Warmup: if you had to pick a modern-day “well” where deep conversations tend to happen—where would it be? (e.g., coffee shop, gym, kitchen table, group chat, long car ride...)

READ John 4:1-43

- What words or phrases are repeated in this passage?
- What do you notice about Jesus’ posture and priorities in this Biblical narrative?
- How does the Samaritan woman respond, and how does her response evolve?

REFLECT

- What does it mean that Jesus leads us OUT with love, not greatness? How does that challenge cultural ideas of success?
- How do dignity and respect shape the way we connect with others? What does it look like to love in a way that preserves both?
- Mother Teresa said, “There is a terrible hunger for love.” Where do you see that hunger in your own life or community?

RESPOND

- Who is someone in your life who may be spiritually or emotionally “thirsty for living water”? What would it look like to meet them at their well?
- Jesus doesn’t ask us to do everything, just a few things. Where is the Holy Spirit stirring you to grow in organic, Spirit-led invitations, drawing others into conversation and purpose with Jesus?”
- How can your Life Group embody this kind of outward movement together? (e.g., service project, invitation, prayer walk)
