Oct. 27 - Nov. 1/ Day 1: Read Matthew 27:1-2; Luke 22:66-71: Thee verses bring the conclusion of the conspiracy of the priests, Pharisees, & scribes—the religious elite.

- Q. Why are they so greatly opposed to Jesus and His message of love and forgiveness?
- Q. Where does Jesus's message step on your toes?

Oct. 27 - Nov. 1/ Day 2: Read Matthew 27:3-10: 'Judas hangs himself'

- Q. What do you think about the Sanhedrin's actions in this passage?
- Q. What would you say to someone who felt extremely guilty or depressed?
- Q. How can we avoid the downward spiral of sin, guilt or depression?

Oct. 27 - Nov. 1/ Day 3: Read Matthew 27:11-14; Mark 15:2-5; Luke 23:1-5; John 18:28-38:

- Q. Why might Pilate have been "amazed" by Jesus' answers to his questions?
- Q. Why might Pilate have posed the question: "What is truth?"

Oct. 27 - Nov. 1/ Day 4: Read Matthew 27:15-26; Mark 15:6-15; Luke 23:6-25:

- Q. What do the different perspectives of Jesus' "interview" with Pilate tell you about what went on?
- Q. Compare the responses of the Caiaphas (the Sanhedrin), Pilate, and Herod. What do you see?

Oct. 27 - Nov. 1/ Day 5: Read John 18:39-40; 19:1-6:

- Q. When, like Jesus, have you been willing to stand your ground, regardless of the consequences?
- Q. Why do you think Pilate did what he did? How might Pilate's motive give an answer to the question above?

Oct. 27 - Nov. 1/ Day 6: Study and Meditation - Consider the following questions:

Reconsider the 2nd question from day 4...Add "the people" into the comparison, as well as the disciples.

- Q. What do you see now?
- Q. When you look at your own life, which one of the folks in the question above do you tend to resemble most?
