Food Pantry: To help stock the Food Pantry for future distributions, items needed include diced tomatoes. The Pantry is also collecting warm socks for children, men and women.


David's Parole: David has been granted Parole and he is scheduled

The question of the month is "What does it mean for me to hunger and thirst for righteousness?" First, I am defining righteousness as having a right relationship with God and man. To develop a deep desire for righteousness, we need to look outside of ourselves (and try to see as God sees). Allowing God's Word to soak into our minds and hearts is part of this process. We begin to see the people around us, how they are affected by our words and actions and how we may need to make those relationships right. When we see others as God sees them (as image bearers), we love and have compassion for them.

In the same way, seeing myself as God sees me (a beloved child, redeemed and brought into the family), creates in me a strong desire to humble myself and allow God through His Spirit and His Word to shine a light in every dark corner of my life and mind, so that I might be conformed to the person He created me to be.
