

Priesthood of All Believers

Over the last couple of months, I've so enjoyed the journey we've been on in our Sunday morning scripture. The Narrative Lectionary leads us through the story of God's promise and presence among God's people. This year, I feel like the readings have been preparing us for a particular need I have right now. I'll share more, first about the preparation, then about the need.

These last few Sundays have reminded us that God calls us. God calls us when we feel unqualified... like Moses. God calls us when we have a hard time recognizing God's voice... like Samuel. God provides people to help us with our call... like Aaron. God provides people who encourage us to listen... like Eli. And in every story, at every turn, every step of the way, God promises to be with us!

Martin Luther had a special term for this, "The Priesthood of All Believers." Priests and pastors are people set apart by God with a vocation of ministry, but what troubled Luther was that people thought priests were the ONLY people set apart by God with a vocation of ministry. Luther was adamant that the vocation of ministry was not reserved for ordained clergy alone, but for ALL people of God. Each of us has been uniquely gifted and called to serve God and our neighbors in particular ways. Where does this call come from? Holy Baptism! Luther said that in the waters of baptism, God calls, claims, and sends us out as the Priesthood of All Believers, fully equipped and empowered to live out our vocations of ministry.

Now... the need. I need your help. I need you to consider how God might be calling you to use your gifts in ministry, not just in your own walk of life, but here at

Serving on an Evangelism Team that visits and follows up with our visitors and new members.


Serve on our Outreach Core Team to identify and promote outreach opportunities.

Youth Led Worship November 9

We are blessed with faithful and gifted youth in our congregation and celebrate that they are not the church of the future... they are the church today! We welcome our youth to lead our worship, from musicians to readers to preachers. Our lectionary reading is the story of God appearing to Elijah in the unexpected stillness on the mountain. Adam Krohe will preach, sharing with us how he experiences God in another unexpected way, honeybees.

SERMONS IN NOVEMBER... "CALL OF THE PROPHETS"

In November, the Narrative Lectionary turns to the prophets of the Old Testament. A prophet is literally a mouthpiece for God, speaking truth to power, calling for repentance, and proclaiming hope. We will hear from four prophets this month as their voices echo through the eons, speaking to every generation.

- November 9, Elijah encounters God in the still silence of the wind. Adam Krohe will be our youth preacher, opening our eyes to encounter God in unlikely places.
- November 16, Amos speaks condemning words from God, calling out the people for their empty offerings and demanding justice.
- November 23, Ezekiel speaks not only of the word of God, but the breath of God that brings a valley of dry bones to life. These are words of promise for the Israelites in exile and for us in our wanderings.
- November 30, Jeremiah preaches more words of hope to the exiles in Babylon. God has not forgotten them and has a promise for their future, a promise for us all.



JACKSONVILLE FOOD CENTER

A few weeks ago, Lillian Korous decided to step down as a liaison for Faith Lutheran Church with the Jacksonville Food Center. She served our Faith Family so well with her devoted volunteer work at the Food Center. I had told Lillian that I would help Pat Glyshaw going forward and knew I would have big shoes to fill. Lillian passed away peacefully, and we are very grateful for her service — she will be missed.

The Jacksonville Food Center continues to provide much-needed services in our local community. In September, the Food Center provided food boxes for 608 families or 1,292 people. Additionally, the Food Center provides fruit, vegetables, and other perishable items to those in need of assistance.

In September, our Faith Family donated \$290 to the Food Center. Our Faith Family also donated 7 lbs. of food worth \$35, which Pat delivered to the Center on October 6th. Donations of non-perishable food items are always welcome, and Pat and I are more than willing to deliver any items to the Food Center.
