## Glendale History The First Fifty Years

A sizeable volume would not hold the many memories that exist in the lives of the families involved in Glendale during their life time. The following is a sample of some of the memories handed down.

After the Civil War a post office was located near Glendale. The postmaster was Catherine Boss who also taught school at the Glendale School which was located on the site of the present

Glendale Baptist Church. Rufus Frost was the first teacher and he gave the school the name "Glendale". The school was built in the 1860s on land donated by John and Jane (Traylor) McCaslin. It was a subscription school conducted in a log cabin.

During the Civil War many of the older boys carried guns to school for protection from bushwhackers. Finos Basinger and Lizzie Noles were also teachers in later years. Three schools were built during the following years and each one was destroyed by fire.

In the 1870's a small group of Christian people began meeting in each other's homes for church services. As their numbers grew, they began meeting in the school house, a small one room building. A pastor was not appointed until 1883 when Elder William Bunch agreed to serve. At that time regular meetings were held on the first Saturday before the first Sunday of each month. Sunday school was held only during the warm months of the year. The group was named the Union United Baptist Church.

In 1884 the Glendale Church was organized with the following members: Rev. Baker and wife, Henry McCaslin, Dan Dildy, Mrs. Bill Bonds, Mollie Anderson, Jack Adylotte and wife, Billie May and wife, Adline McCaslin, Lizzie Pyles, Ammie

McCaslin, and Van May and wife.

In 1895, since the small house of worship was destroyed by fire in 1894, it was decided to build a church building separate from the school. John McCaslin gave land for the building site. In May 1895 the congregation voted to call the church the Glendale Missionary Baptist Church. Three years later Claude Mills gave about two acres of land for the building site for a parsonage.

In 1896 the church was received into the Concord Baptist Association. Glendale was Southern Baptist prior to that and was associated with the Buckner Association.

In 1903, Glendale ordained J.H. Ray as a Deacon. During this same year, Henry Goss joined Glendale as a Deacon.

In 1905 the church had grown until it was able to call as pastor, Rev. J.W. Comer as pastor at an annual salary of \$105.00. (D.M. Bryant served in 1896 for \$15.00) In 1910 it was decided to check into possibilities of building still another larger building since the membership now totaled 64 regular attending members. The total cost of the new building was determined to be \$406.45. The old building was sold to the highest bidder and the amount paid was applied on the cost of the new one.

In April of 1911 Jim Harp and Marshall Ray were ordained as deacons. Later that year J.T. Cobb joined the church as a deacon.

On Sunday, March 17, 1912, the congregation voted to organize a Sunday school. The following officers were elected to serve: Bro. Will Lassiter, Superintendent, Jim Harp, Assistant Superintendent, Alma Moore, Secretary-Treasurer, Zola Stanley, and Assistant Secretary-Treasurer. George Stanley, Chorister, and Mary Scott, Organist.

A Ladies Aid Society was organized in 1912. A collection of \$2.03 was taken for mission work.

Under the leadership of Rev. J.W. Comer the church went to half time preaching in 1915 and shortly after added a Baptist Young People's Union. Officers elected were, H.G. Thomason, President, Roy Bryant, Vice President, Lena Comer, Secretary-Treasurer.

H.G. Thomason joined the church as deacon, from Florence, Drew Co. AR. He had been ordained in 1899.

## Changes

Changes were not only taking place in 1872 in the Glendale Community but in the whole United States as well.

Yellowstone National Park, Henihco'oo in Arapaho, was established by Congress and signed into law by President Ulysses G Grant. Native Americans had lived there for at least 11,000 years.

Grant was elected to his second term. He defeated Horace Greely, who consequently died on November 29, and his electoral votes were divided among several candidates. During this time Victoria Woodhull became the first woman nominated for President of the United States, although she was too young to qualify.

**Women's Suffrage:** In defiance of the law, American suffragist Susan B Anthony voted for the first time. On November 18 she was served an arrest warrant and in her subsequent trial was fined \$100. She never paid the fine.

The Great Boston Fire consumed over 65 acres, most of Boston's downtown. 776 buildings were destroyed, 30 people lost their lives.

The Panic of 1873, which was the beginning of the Great Depression or Long Depression, began.

## The Next Fifty Years

Glendale Baptist continued to grow and prosper. In 1925 the following men were ordained to serve as deacons: R.L. Robinson, Walter Littlefield, N.L. Bryant, Will Means, Jess Nelson, and Walter Bryant.



Because of the growth in 1927 the church voted to build a five room addition. Eleven years later the building was lost to fire. Having no insurance, the church members were not able to rebuild immediately. During this time services were held in the deacon's homes. Later services were held in the Forty-four School Building. However, in 1939 the building was eventually replaced with a one-room wooden structure

capable of seating 400 people.



New pews were purchased in 1949.

In 1949 a more complete church program was initiated. Bro. John Westfall was ordained into the ministry and was called as pastor. He served on a three quarter basis time of preaching. His salary was \$60.00 per month.



In 1952 and 1953 a new sanctuary was attached to the building. The new basement under the sanctuary was used as a church kitchen and dining area for special dinners often given during those years. The entire building was rock veneered by William Wesley Goff.







By 1958 the church had grown and prospered and they were able to call their first full-time pastor, Rev. Ray Kesner.

In 1959 Glendale ordained four deacons: Gordon Guthrie, Glyn Damron, Harry Culps, and Donald Fennell.

In 1960 a Library was begun. Mrs. Kesner served as librarian with Tawana Phillips as assistant. Mrs. Eva Jo Franks served later.

In 1963 the church purchased an organ.

In 1964 the church built a baptistery. A new piano was purchased.

In 1966 the church erected an educational building, constructed of concrete blocks and contained eight classrooms and a pastor's study.



In 1968 carpet was installed in the auditorium.


In 1969 central heat and air was installed in the auditorium.

In 1971 a new bedroom and bathroom was added to the pastor's home, as well as installing carpet, and new tile was placed in the kitchen and dining area.

1972 new children's classes were started. Dolores Earp taught the two and three year olds, Freddie Trotter taught the third and fourth grades. Central heat and air were installed in the educational building.

## The Next Forty Years


In 1984, a kitchen and dining room were added, and in 1986 a second floor containing seven classrooms and a pastor's study were added to the exiting educational building.



In 1990 the rock veneered building was demolished, making room for a new sanctuary. Construction was begun immediately. During this time split services were held in the fellowship hall of the educational building.

In 1993 Training Union was discontinued for the summer months and was phased out and the evening services became a worship and prayer time.

It was voted on in 1993 to build a Family Life Center.



In 1995 a new parsonage was built across the street from the church building. The land for the parsonage was donated by W.C. and A.B. Littlefield.

The new family life center, containing a new kitchen and a gymnasium, was erected in 1995.

Glendale Baptist was incorporated in 1996.

In 1998 a Glendale Church sign was erected on Highway 10.




During the pastorate of Bro. Tim Smith a Wild Game Banquet was held and has continued each year up until the present time. The purpose of the event is to reach more people in the community for Jesus Christ.

A two-story addition of new classrooms and office space was added to the front of the Family Life Center in 2007. The south side of the upstairs portion of the Family Life Center is devoted to the youth and their activities.



A new dining room was added to the west side of the building in 2010.







After eighty-six years in existence, Glendale Baptist Church called its first full-time pastor in 1958.







We, at Glendale, hope that the Lord will continue to bless his ministry and he might stay on the field for years to come.




A note from the Pastor ...



**Glendale has been blessed with many members through the years who were willing to serve in the music ministry of the church.**







## **Memories of the past....**

### **June (Damron) Culps recalls:**

Before city water the old parsonage had double iron water. A group of our ladies met together and decided to make plastic cats out of plastic drop cloths and pipe cleaners. They made 300 beautiful cats and sold them for \$3.00 each and bought the water filtering system for the old parsonage. The cat making ladies were Clem Damron, Wenona Damron, Altha Damron, June Culps, Velma Earp, Effie Meeks, Retha Pennington and others.

### **Patsy (Earp) Corbitt recalls:**

A favorite memory that I have is attending Bible School at Glendale. Joe Earp and I rode an ole gray mare (Dap) to and from the school. Ole Dap was more than ready to go home when they turned out. I can still remember how good the play dough smelled that Virginia McCaslin made. It was pink. I remember in the old wooden building the men would sit on the North side of the building and the women on the South.

### **Joe Earp recalls:**

When I was a young lad, about seven or eight years old, growing up at Glendale, I had a dog named Youno. He went to church with me sometimes and lay in the doorway at the back of the church. One Sunday as the preacher was preaching, he said "if everyone was a faithful about being here as that dog, we would have a full house". This made me real proud of old Youno.

### **Theda (Meeks) Wilson recalls:**

Theda recalls accepting the Lord in 1941, just before moving from the Camp area to become neighbors to June (Damron) Culps and her family. She was then baptized in the Washburn Narrows as so many people from Glendale. She, her brother Kenneth, June, and the Sharbers, Bonnie, Judas, Sam and Vanita would walk the three miles to Glendale to church. Sometimes her younger sister, Adeline, would want to go but would tire when walking up the hill home and would have to be carried. They would stop along the way and get a drink of cool water from an open well on the May's property.

**Pansy (Earp) Fennell recalls:**

Pansy recalls the time when she was twenty five years old. She stepped out on faith when Bro. Kent had brought the message. When I stepped out something lifted from my heart and I cried all evening with happiness. Reba Gibson said, "Pansy, you caused us to have a Revival at Glendale". My Grandpa Earp and my Daddy spent the evening with us.

**Kay (Damron) Fennell recalls:**

One of my favorite memories is when I was about nine years old, Mrs. Crossland, our pastor's wife, would have seven or eight neighborhood girls, on Saturday afternoons, under a big oak tree in front of the church, and would teach us to memorize Bible verses, sing songs, memorize Bible Books, and to realize that we were sinners and needed a savior. This led to the conviction of the Holy Spirit, and my salvation the following year.
