"When the Pastor Wept"

Paul was not a celebrity preacher.

He was a missionary. A teacher. A tentmaker. A spiritual father. A tearful shepherd.

In Acts 18–20, we see Paul the pastor, not just Paul the preacher. He plants churches, builds leaders, reasons in synagogues, and even raises a sleepy teenager from the dead (shoutout to Eutychus). But it's in his final address to the Ephesian elders that we see the soul of a faithful shepherd laid bare.

"I did not shrink from declaring the whole counsel of God."

"I served with humility and tears."

"I consider my life worth nothing... if only I may finish the race."

These aren't the words of a man chasing applause. They're the words of a man who loved people more than comfort, who saw ministry as a marathon rather than a spotlight, and who knew the greatest measure of success is not fame but faithfulness. Paul poured out his life so that others might know Christ. His ministry was marked not by polish, but by perseverance—not by ease, but by endurance.

And notice what Paul leaves behind. Not a five-year plan. Not a strategy. Not a stack of leadership manuals. He leaves them with grace. He commends the elders "to God and to the word of His grace," trusting that what he built with tears would be sustained by the Spirit.

It's a beautiful reminder to us all—whether we are leading a church, raising a family, mentoring a teen, or simply walking beside a friend through a hard season. What matters most isn't how loud we are, but how deeply we love, how humbly we serve, and how fully we finish.

There is something sacred about tears in ministry—tears shed in prayer, in loss, in gratitude, in longing. Paul's tears remind us that ministry, in any form, is holy ground where love and sacrifice meet.

This week, consider your own "race." Are we pouring out our lives for the sake of others? Are we shrinking back—or pressing on? When we finish, may we be able to say, like Paul, "I have fought the good fight... I have finished the race... I have kept the faith."

Grace and perseverance, Laugh often and Fear not! David!








The Deacons will be providing communion preparation training. Deacon Sandy Gandy purchased new crosses for new member bags, ordered Thanksgiving cards. Advertising for the Service of Solace (Sunday, December 7) will be placed in a Sun City magazine "SCS Life."

Pastor David read to Session a letter of thanks from the Dendy family for the support of Session, staff, and the congregation during Faith Dendy's health issues. Pastor David had postponed the annual staff reviews and will undertake the reviews soon. Pledge cards for the fall pledge drive will be sent the week of October 27 with Dedication Sunday on November 9. The Church Picnic on October 19 was a great celebration with 100 people in attendance.

The Magnify Commission (matters relating to worship). Pastor Appreciation Sunday is October 26. Communion by intinction will be served on Commitment Sunday, November 9. Advent begins on Sunday, November 30. Plans are for decorating the Church for Advent and Christmas Sunday, November 23 at 4:00 p.m. We will invite Grace Presbyterian to participate. Pizza will be served. Elder Karla Canfield has been working with Domsky Glass Company on fabricating a new baptismal font for MVPC. Elder Canfield hopes to have a prototype soon. The performance of the Messiah by the joint choirs of MVPC and Grace Presbyterian is subject to the schedule for construction completion of Grace's new church facility.

The Serve Commission (serving others outside of MVPC). The presentation of "Protecting our Children" October 5 was a great event and well received. The Church Picnic on October 19 included a pet blessing of 16 dogs. Thanks Pastor Gary Wall and the Pet Ministry team. Holiday Giving Opportunities: Thanksgiving Boxes (150 boxes) for Olive Crest to be returned on November 2. Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes collection for Samaritan's Purse will be available for pickup on November 2 and returned by November 16.TBD. Salvation Army Angel Tree donations are hopefully to be reinitiated. The Project 150 the "Denim Drive" finishes on October 26 focusing on new and old jeans for teens - the collection bin was full and overflowing. Food Banks - \$820.00 was donated by the Men's breakfast crew for the month of October to Westminster Presbyterian Church and Salvation Army food donations for October was estimated at a value of \$5000.00. The Women's Ministry plans to donate Christmas presents to Club Christ children at the December Tea Party. The Hoving Home Night of Hope Gala on October 16, 2025 was attended by 9 MVPC.

Stewardship Commission (being good managers of time, talents, and treasures). Electrical repairs to bring the elevator into code compliance are being scheduled. The solar power system has been serviced and is operating at full potential power generation.

Elder Karla Canfield has agreed to be moderator of the Nominating Committee and has enlisted Laura Martin (Elder Representative), Nancy Amato, Barb Maletsky, and Sara Kirschman (Deacon Representatives), John Bull, Cam Camburn and Richard Becker (members at large) to serve on the Committee. A Congregational Meeting will be held on Sunday, November 2 between services to elect the Nominating Committee.

The scheduled November Session meeting is the day before Thanksgiving. Session voted meet on Wednesday, December 3 at 7:00 p.m. for its November/December meeting.

Here are the books and meeting dates for the upcoming months.






Grocery Program


The holidays are great times to boost our Mission giving by participating in our Grocery Program, with a portion of your purchases returned to MVCP:

- 1. **Smith's**. Smith's program, called **Inspiring Donations**, rebates to the Church a portion of your purchases. Please update the registration of your Smith's Reward Card number (or phone number) at www.smithsfoodanddrug.com/inspire. The Church's organization number is CF673. After registration, every purchase at Smith's earns money for the Church.
- 2. **Albertsons and Vons**. Purchase Albertsons gift cards, which are useable at all Albertson's, Vons and other affiliated stores across the country, including Acme (Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware), Jewel/Osco (Illinois), Safeway (throughout the West), Kings (New Jersey, New York and Connecticut), Randalls (Texas), Shaw's and Star Markets (New England). Albertsons gives the Church 5% of the amount of the gift card purchased (\$100 gift card = \$5 to MVPC).

When multiplied by dozens of participants, our returns become substantial. Through the three quarters of 2025 thus far, Smith's sent MVPC \$363.316 from participation in the Inspiring Donations program. So far this year, MVPC's return on Albertsons/Vons gift cards has been \$150. Albertsons/Vons gift cards also make great gifts! You can purchase Albertsons gift cards from Jeff Patterson.
