Nov. 17-22/ Day 1: Read Mark 16:14; John 20:24-31; 21:1-14: 'Jesus appears to Thomas'

- Q. When have you struggled with disbelief when someone told you something the Lord did for them?
- Q. Do you think Jesus was harsh in Mark? How do John's readings fit in the picture at this point?

Nov. 17-22/ Day 2: Read John 21:15-25: 'Jesus reinstates Peter'

- Q. How did Peter feel after Jesus had asked him the same question three times? (v. 17)
- **Q.** What did Jesus want Peter to concern Himself with? (v. 22)
- Q. How can you bring glory to God through your life and the unique opportunities God has given you?

Nov. 17-22/ Day 3: Read Matthew 28:16-20; Mark 16:15-18: 'The Great Commission'

- Q. What does it mean to "make disciples?" What is your personal role in making disciples?
- Q. What do you see as your personal role in helping spread the Good News about Jesus?

Nov. 17-22/ Day 4: Read Luke 24:44-49: 'Jesus with the disciples'

- **Q.** When did the disciples finally understand the Scriptures? (v. 44-45)
- Q. In what ways have you experienced the power that Jesus promised us?

Nov. 17-22/ **Day 5: Read Mark 16:19-20; Luke 24:50-53:** 'The Ascension'

- Q. What is the most significant thing happening here? Why is that significant?
- Q. Why is it appropriate and important for all followers of Jesus to praise and worship Him?

Nov. 17-22/ Day 6: Study and Meditation – Consider the following questions:

- Q. How have you changed/grown (or not) because of what you've encountered in the Gospels this year?
- 'Scripture may have been written for all believers, but it was not (necessarily) written to all believers.'
- Q. How might this past year of reading demonstrate the truth (or falsehood) of this statement?
