## LIFEGROUP DISCUSSION GUIDE



## Psalm 133, a 'Song of Ascents' traditionally sung by pilgrims traveling to Jerusalem for

festivals. The psalm celebrates the goodness and beauty of God's people dwelling together in unity. JMT challenges the congregation to think of unity not merely as the absence of conflict, but as actively pursuing authentic relationships within the church community. Using vivid imagery of precious oil and refreshing dew, the psalm promises God's blessing and eternal life when believers genuinely live in harmony together. The message emphasizes that Jesus prayed for unity among believers as a witness to the world, and that the church is designed to be
