From the Pastors View: 'Christmas in Virginia'

Well, we've arrived. Another Christmas season is upon us as it seems to arrive like Santa Claus when we least expect it. Yes, it's on our calendar, so it must be here!

I don't know what you've been going through the last few weeks or months, but in some ways living here in Virginia, Christmas can be either a very joyous, or a somewhat hard time of year, depending of course on our life circumstances.

Now, as a pastor, each Christmas season presents somewhat of a challenge...How does one take a Christmas story of Jesus's birth (that we have heard many times) and still make it interesting or challenging in a Sunday message? So, in preparation for our series of messages, I typed into Google 'Christmas in Virginia' and this is what Google gave back to me about some books that are set in Virginia at Christmas. (I have not read or do I endorse them; this is just for illustrative purposes):

Merry Christmas!



From the Deacons...Jubilee Churches of Gloucester - November update:

In October, Jubilee Churches (of which Newington is a member of) provided support to **THREE** households in our community with \$2,497. Those financial requests included rent, Dominion power assistance. And as of the end of October, Jubilee collectively has helped 55 households with \$25,713 in just under two years!!

Here is just one example of how Newington's Jubilee support was used in October:

Because of the faithful giving of the Jubilee Churches, a local family of seven — two parents and five children — recently received much-needed help to keep their lights on and stay in their home. The father, who serves in the National Guard, was not paid

for his recent 28-day duty due to the current government shutdown. And in addition to his military service, he is self-employed; but his time away meant he was unable to earn income from his business.

This unexpected gap in pay created a serious financial strain for the family. Thanks to your generous support with Jubilee, we were able to step in and cover their Dominion Power bill.

This assistance brought tremendous relief and stability during a stressful time — helping them avoid falling behind and keeping their home warm and bright for their children.

Newington because of your generosity to our NBC deacon fund, we were able to support Jubilee and this family (along with others) who were able to avoid homelessness and keep a roof over their heads.

Thank you for being the hands and feet of Christ in our community and for helping families stay housed, hopeful, and cared for.

A final reminder too, Jubilee works with the GUEST ministry in our area. We will be hosting the GUESTs beginning **Monday December 29 - Sunday January 5.** Please consider signing up and helping us with a shift or two, giving love and care to those without homes or food. Thanks!
