"While You Wait..."

Waiting is hard enough. Waiting without answers is even harder. But waiting in silence — that's the kind of waiting that tests the soul.

Luke introduces us to Zechariah and Elizabeth as two people who know that kind of waiting well. Scripture describes them as righteous, faithful, and blameless — yet their deepest longing, the desire for a child, had gone unmet for decades. Their story begins not with a miracle, but with quiet disappointment.

And then one day, while Zechariah is serving in the temple, God breaks the silence: "Your prayer has been heard." These words reveal something beautiful about God's heart. He does not forget the prayers we forget. He does not lose the petitions we have laid down. He remembers the ones prayed with tears years ago, long before we believed a miracle was still possible.

Zechariah's imposed silence becomes an unexpected grace. During nine months without speaking, he is invited to listen more deeply, reflect more honestly, and believe more fully. His waiting becomes a classroom of spiritual formation. God does some of His most transformative work in us while we wait.

Elizabeth's response captures the essence of hope: "The Lord has done this for me." She names her blessing not as coincidence, or luck, or timing — but as the work of God's faithfulness.

Their story speaks into our waiting today. Many of us carry prayers that feel unanswered, longings that remain unfulfilled, or hopes that seem delayed. Advent invites us to bring those tender places to God with honesty and expectation. Divine silence is not divine absence. The God who remembered Zechariah and Elizabeth remembers us.

While you wait, God is working.

While you wait, God is shaping.

While you wait, God is orchestrating.

While you wait, God is aligning.

While you wait, God is refining.

GOD IS WORKING

While you wait, God is preparing the blessing that will one day leave you saying,

"The Lord has done this for me."






MVPC Deacons will be hosting our annual Service of Solace. All are welcome, open to the public.

While some anxiously await the coming of Christ, others dread the holiday season. Join us for a quiet Christmas service provided for those who aren't feeling the cheer of the season.



Stewardship Notes

Jesus taught more about money and possessions than He did about heaven or hell. The word "give" is used more than 1,500 times in the Bible, more than the words faith, hope, love, or pray. Why? Obviously, God does not need our money. He is not poor; to the contrary, He is the most generous giver and everything we have is a gift from Him. The Bible teaches that God wants our giving to be a deeply meaningful expression of worship in three dimensions -- past, present and future.

First, our giving expresses our gratitude to God for the past. When we give back to God, we express our appreciation to Him for all the ways He has blessed us. God wants our giving to be motivated by gratitude. 2 Corinthians 9:7 provides: "Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."

Second, our giving expresses our priorities in the present. If you want to know what a person really values, just look at their calendar and their checkbook. The way people spend their time and money reveals what is really important to them. When we give the first part of our income to God, it is evidence that God holds first place in our hearts. Jesus said, "For wherever your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21).

Third, our giving expresses our faith in God for the future. God sees our giving as a test of our faith. In Malachi 3:10, God says, "Bring your whole tithe into my storehouse (Temple) ... Test me in this and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it." God challenges us, daring us to trust His promise to take care of us as we put Him first in our finances.

Giving back to God represents thanks for all He has done in our lives and is the heart of worship.






is found in the life of Jesus Christ. Enjoy this light-hearted children's series that will make your kids laugh and leave them with important truths to consider.




