



“Expect Delays”

Delays are almost never welcome, especially when traveling over the holidays this time of the year. They halt our momentum, interrupt our plans, and test our patience. Yet Scripture reveals that God often works most powerfully in the very places where we experience life’s interruptions. What we call a delay, God often calls preparation.

Joseph’s story in Matthew 1 is a masterclass in faithful waiting during unexpected delays. He learns that Mary is pregnant — news that shatters his expectations and threatens to unravel his future. Joseph feels blindsided, confused, and heartbroken. The life he thought he was stepping into dissolves in a single conversation. And yet, even in this moment of disappointment, he chooses compassion. He resolves to break the engagement quietly, refusing to add shame to Mary’s already complicated story. Joseph reminds us that our character is revealed not when life goes as planned, but when it doesn’t.

It is in the middle of Joseph’s confusion that heaven breaks in. An angel appears with words Joseph desperately needs: “Do not be afraid... what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit.” God interrupts Joseph’s interruption. Divine revelation enters the chaos of human uncertainty. Before giving Joseph direction, God reminds him of his identity: “Joseph, son of David.” God names him correctly so Joseph can step forward faithfully. The delay is no longer random; it is now sacred ground.

Joseph’s delay becomes God’s direction. His detour becomes his destiny. The interruption he never wanted places him at the center of salvation history as the earthly father of Jesus. What looked like a devastating setback was actually the divine setup for God’s greatest gift. The story of redemption moved forward through a man who was willing to trust when nothing made sense.

This Advent, many of us are facing delays — in relationships, in health, in careers, in long-standing prayers we keep offering with weary hearts. Some delays feel discouraging. Others feel disorienting. But Joseph’s story reminds us that delays are not dead ends in the kingdom of God. They are invitations to trust anew, listen deeper, and follow obediently. God does some of His most transformative work in the seasons we least prefer.

So yes — expect delays in life. But also expect God to meet you in them. His purposes are never thwarted by our interruptions. Often, they unfold beautifully through them.

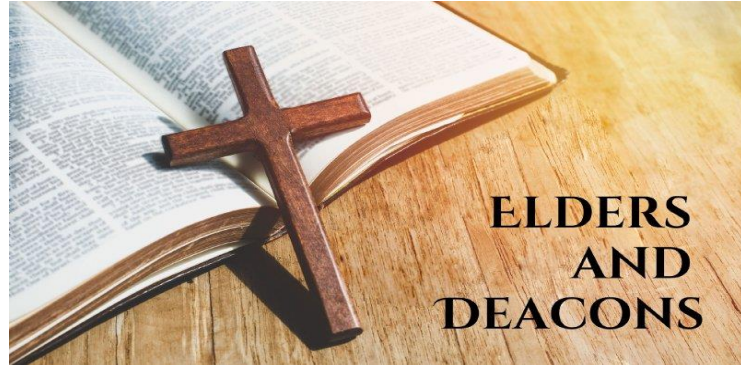

November/December 2025 Session Meetings Highlights

Session met December 3 for both its November and December meetings.

The Deacons are finalizing plans for the Service of Solace on Sunday, December 7.

Pastor David reported that the Advent sermon series is entitled "The Waiting Room of God." 2026 sermons will start out with the Book of Proverbs. The Staff Christmas lunch is December 15. Christmas Eve Services will be at 4:00, 6:00 and 10:00 p.m. The Messiah will be presented on December 7 and at Grace Presbyterian's service at 2:00 p.m. on December 14. On December 3, Gary Wall and Pastor David attended the Family Promis luncheon in its new facility.

The Magnify Commission (matters relating to worship). Approximately 37 helpers, including members of Grace Presbyterian, decorated the Church for Christmas on November 23. The Commission continues to work with Domsy Glass Company on fabricating a new baptismal font for MVPC. Sundays, December 28 and January 4 will have just one service at 10:00 a.m. The Commission will hold usher and greeter training in January.

The Serve Commission (serving others outside of MVPC). Elder Laura Martin reported on advancing 2026 food bank distributions to assist with the effects of the government shutdown. MVPC sent \$2,000 to Presbyterian Disaster Relief earmarked to assist victims of Hurricane Melissa, primarily in Jamaica. The Pet Ministry annual bake sale will be held in February. The denim collection to benefit Project 150 was valued at approximately \$3,000. MVPC filled 125 Thanksgiving food boxes for Olive Crest. And 150 Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes for Samaritan's Purse. Olive Crest "Be the Miracle" toys and gift cards donations collected on December 7. Food Banks - \$975.00 was donated by the Men's breakfast crew for the month of November to Westminster Presbyterian Church (which fed 300 families for Thanksgiving) and Salvation Army food donations for October was estimated at a value of \$5000.00. The Quilting Group which meets at MVPC donated \$3,000 for missions.

The Nurture Commission (taking care of our congregation) is updating its policies manual. The Youth Group has enjoyed combining with youth from Grace and Green Valley Presbyterian Churches for various activities. Bible studies are all going well. Christmas caroling is on December 14. Women's Ministry events - Just Us visited the Bellagio conservatory; Women's Christmas brunch on December 6 has almost 50 signed up.

The Gather Commission (taking care of gathering in large and small groups). A special thank you to Gary Wall for cooking for the 5th Sunday Brunch on November 30. A wonderful kickoff to Advent.

Stewardship Commission (being good managers of time, talents, and treasures). Electrical repairs to bring the elevator into code compliance were performed. The elevator still needs fire marshall approval for the repairs. The gardeners will be removing a number of bushes and replacing them with plants requiring less water. The parking lot lighting has been upgraded with new LED fixtures providing significantly more light.

Elder Karla Canfield, moderator of the Nominating Committee, reported on nominees. Session set December 14 for a special Congregational meeting to elect new Elders and Deacons for terms beginning January 1, 2026. Session also scheduled the annual Congregational meeting for Sunday, February 22.

The next scheduled Session meeting is on Wednesday, January 28 at 7:00 p.m.

The Creators Christmas Special (Family)

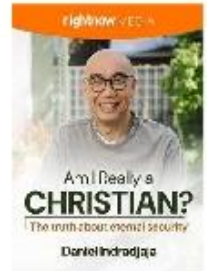

Grocery Program

Your holiday grocery shopping can boost our Mission giving. Just participate in our Grocery Program, with a portion of your purchases returned to MVCP:

1. **Smith's.** Smith's program, called **Inspiring Donations**, rebates to the Church a portion of your purchases. Please update the registration of your Smith's Reward Card number (or phone number) at www.smithsfoodanddrug.com/inspire. The Church's organization number is CF673. After registration, every purchase at Smith's earns money for the Church.
2. **Albertsons and Vons.** Purchase Albertsons gift cards, which are useable at all Albertson's, Vons, and other affiliated stores across the country, including Acme (Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware), Jewel/Osco (Illinois), Safeway (throughout the West), Kings (New Jersey, New York and Connecticut), Randalls (Texas), Shaw's and Star Markets (New England). Albertsons gives the Church 5% of the amount of the gift card purchased (\$100 gift card = \$5 to MVPC).

When multiplied by dozens of participants, our returns become substantial. Through the first three quarters of 2025, Smith's sent MVPC \$363.31 from participation in the Inspiring Donations program. So far this year, MVPC's return on Albertsons/Vons gift cards has been \$250. Albertsons/Vons gift cards also make great gifts! 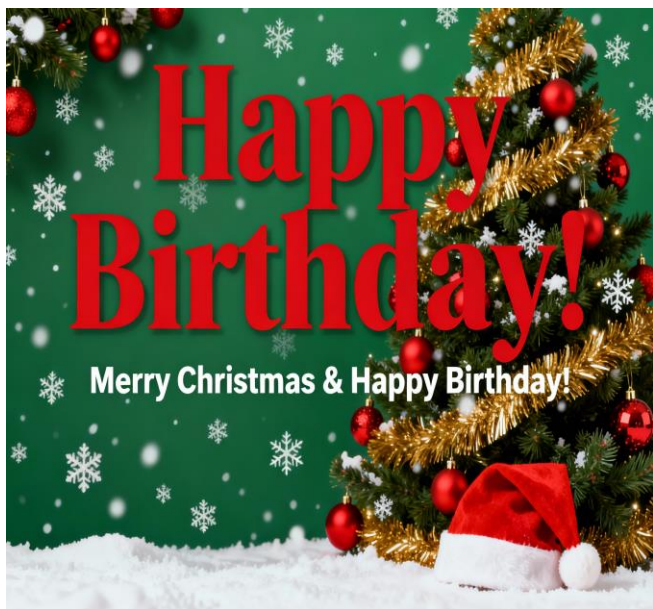
