### CONFETTI CANON CELEBRATION

Last night, our family caused a major ruckus. We counted down with a timer on tv, and when it hit zero, a confetti cannon exploded in our living room and we were whooping, hollering, and shouting “Happy New Year” at the top of our lungs. There was one catch... it was 9:15 pm! It was already past Desmond’s bedtime, but he wanted to join in the celebration, so we watched a recording of the New Year’s fireworks celebration in London.

I started wondering, what’s the big deal about a new year? It’s really quite amazing to think about people around the globe celebrating. There’s no other holiday that touches so many, regardless of religion or culture, as the entire world celebrates together, every hour in their own time zone, all because of something new.

It’s a fresh start. It’s an opportunity to put some things behind us and let go. It’s an opportunity to start new things and challenge ourselves to make positive changes. But what’s the big deal about 12:00 a.m. on January 1? As our family proved last night, we can celebrate the fresh start of something new anytime we want, because every moment is a new beginning.

Not only that, but because of Christ, the newness we experience is more than an opportunity to try to be a better version of ourselves. Because of Christ, WE are made new! As Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 5:17, “Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation. The old has passed and the new has come.”

Paul tells this to the Corinthians as part of a larger explanation of reconciliation. This new creation we experience is a gift from God. Because of Christ,

when looking at us, God no longer sees our sins as our primary identity, counting them against us. No. Because of Christ, God sees beyond our sin and sees our identity as beloved, forgiven, children of God. This is God’s gift of reconciliation, that we don’t have to wait for a certain day, or be baptized again, or say a particular prayer. God has done this in Jesus, and our life is lived in response and celebration of this gift. This is something we can celebrate every day... every minute... and Martin Luther encouraged us to do so.

Martin Luther recommended that the first thing we do when we wake up is to make the sign of the cross, remember our baptism, give thanks for the new life we have in Christ, and go joyfully about your work. Then, at the end of each day, the last thing we do is to again make the sign of the cross, thank God for the day, ask for forgiveness, commend yourself to God’s care, and go to sleep at once and in good cheer.

This is good advice from Luther, but let’s go back to Paul for a moment. In 1 Corinthians 5 where he proclaims that we are a new creation because of our reconciliation in Christ, Paul tells us that God also gave us a ministry of reconciliation. “From now on, regard no one from a worldly point of view.” A worldly point of view counts one another’s sins against them. When we see one another, we see the sin first, and that becomes their identity and defines our relationship. But God gave us a ministry of reconciliation, so that we can see as God sees, not preoccupied by one’s sins, faults, or differences from us, but as beloved, forgiven, children of God. When we participate in this ministry of reconciliation, not just giving thanks that we have been reconciled to God in Christ, but extending that reconciliation to others... now that’s something new that’s really worth a confetti canon celebration.

## SERMONS IN THE SEASON OF EPIPHANY - THE GOSPEL OF JOHN

The season of Epiphany begins on January 6, on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of Christmas, and concludes on Ash Wednesday with the beginning of Lent on February 18. This year, the Narrative Lectionary walks us through the entire Gospel of John. From its beginning with John's birth account ("In the beginning was the Word") to Jesus' resurrection and what comes next with Thomas, the disciples, and the church, you'll find that John's gospel is very different from the others. Matthew, Mark, and Luke are "synoptic gospels," so similar that they are seen together. In the weeks ahead, we will dig deeper into John's gospel and this different way of seeing Jesus, his ministry, and the community of believers that followed him and of which we are a part.
