Wisdom for 2026: When Faith and Action Move Together

Planning is part of being human. We plan our schedules, our finances, our careers, and our futures. We plan conversations, vacations, and even backup plans for our backup plans. Planning itself isn't the problem—it's how much weight we carry while doing it.

The Book of Proverbs speaks directly to this tension between faith and action. Rather than discouraging planning, Proverbs invites us to rethink who is carrying the responsibility for the outcome. Wisdom, Scripture suggests, is not about giving up on effort or ambition, but about learning how to move forward without being crushed by the burden of control.

One of the great challenges of modern life is that we are expected to plan extensively while also navigating constant uncertainty. The result can be anxiety, pressure, and the feeling that everything depends on us. Proverbs offers a different vision—one where responsibility is shared, direction is guided, and movement is grounded in trust.

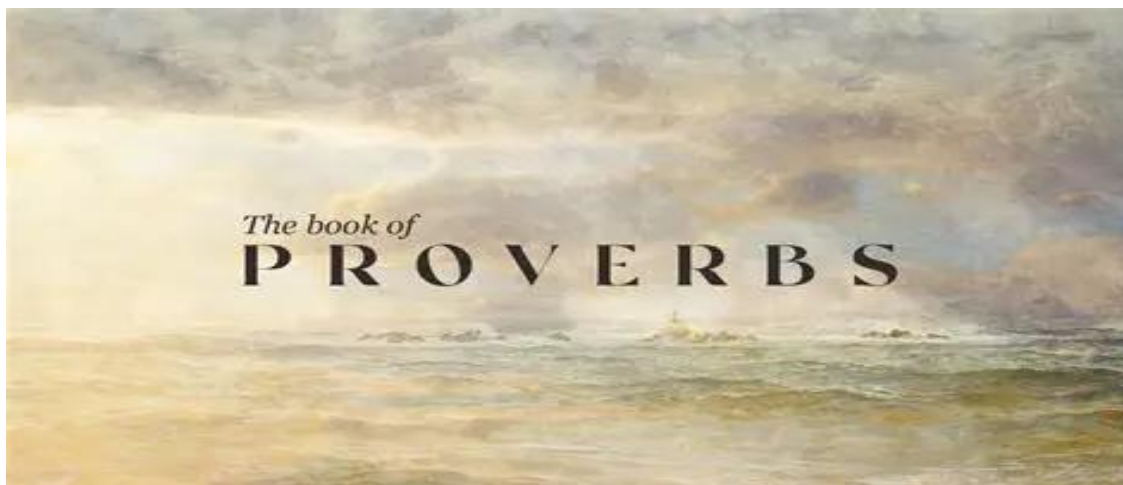
In the *Wisdom for 2026* sermon series, we've been exploring how ancient wisdom speaks powerfully to modern life. This week's focus invites us to consider how faith and action work together. Wisdom is not passive waiting, nor is it frantic striving. It is purposeful movement shaped by trust in God.

Scripture consistently reminds us that while we make plans, God remains deeply involved in directing our steps. That truth doesn't remove effort—it redeems it. When we learn to place our plans into God's hands, we discover freedom to move forward with courage rather than fear.

This week's message is especially relevant for anyone facing decisions, transitions, or uncertainty. It speaks to careers, families, finances, ministry, and everyday choices. Wisdom invites us not to stand still, but to move forward with humility, prayer, and confidence that we are not carrying life alone.

Join us this Sunday as our *Wisdom for 2026* series continues. Together, we'll explore what it means to plan wisely, trust deeply, and move forward faithfully—discovering again where wisdom begins.

If Christians are "saved by grace," totally apart from good works, what difference does it make if we Do Good or not? In this series, from the book of Titus, Chip Ingram reveals that there are four key reasons why Doing Good matters so much.
