From the Pastors View: 'Snow, A Reflection Who We are in Jesus'

Let me begin with some 'dad joke puns' (our Wednesday night Deeper Bible study crew loves these so much :

"Jesus loves you snow much!"

"The Son can warm your winter days."

"When life gives you more than you can stand, kneel."

Now, as we all well know, January and February can AND HAS brought us some serious winter weather. But snow also can bring a unique stillness, as we are draped in a blanket of snow- a reminder too that we as followers of Jesus live under a blanket of grace. Like a snow day at home, we are invited to slow down and witness God's work all around us.

So, as you slow down and spend a few more hours and days at home due to our winter weather, please consider all the blessings we have in and through Jesus:

'We are all unique by our design!' – Just as no two snowflakes are identical, we too are all purposefully handcrafted by our creator. Also, if we take a minute to watch a snowflake, each of them is quite fragile. However, when a snowflake is joined together with other snowflakes, it creates noticeable inches of snow. Likewise, when we are joined together as believers, we can reflect the Body of Christ, the church to a watching, waiting and needy world!

'We can and should rest in the stillness of Jesus!' – If you are outside during a snowstorm, you know how it has a way of muffling all the world's noise around us, specifically with less cars out on the roads. So, the stillness of falling snow should remind us, that we have a divine invitation to rest and practice more stillness and quietness in our daily lives. As the sons of Korah write in Psalms, ***"Be still, and know that I am God. I will be exalted among the nations; I will be exalted in the earth!"*** -Psalm 46:10 (ESV)

'We are whiter than snow because of God's great forgiveness!' - Have you ever seen a field or a front yard of several inches of snow, when no one has marked it by stepping in the snow? The field or yard can appear to be pristine. No imperfections in it at all. This is what Jesus did by his death and resurrection from the cross. He completely covers our imperfections! As David is asking ... ***"Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow."*** - Psalm 51:7 (ESV)

'We can grow as we spend this season of our lives in preparation!' –As snow nourishes our earth and is necessary for the coming spring growth next month, the winter snow of our souls can be for us a time for healing and regrouping, before a new season of life begins.

Today, may we all remember that God has complete sovereignty over every detail of His creation. Now, I know we all intellectually agree with this fact. However, this is also true in His sovereignty over God's human creation, as we are created in His image.

This month, may we all reflect Him (in how we live) to a watching, waiting, and at times, a snowy and cold world!

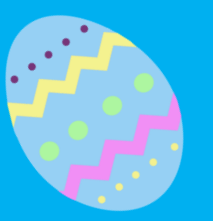
Salvation Army "Soup" Sunday Feb 8

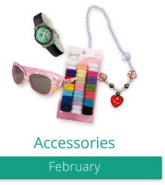

A girl who once received an Operation Christmas Child shoebox now teaches *The Greatest Journey* discipleship course to other children in need.



Of the 25 provinces in Cambodia, Samaritan’s Purse operates its Operation Christmas Child project in 14 of them. The barriers to reaching people who live in the urban slums within them with the Gospel seem insurmountable. Residents often harbor a deep resentment and fear of Christianity. Visoth first met Samnang when he visited the slums with the goal of sharing the Gospel. They gathered together under a tree in a graveyard. While surrounded by evidence of our earthly mortality, these children heard the message of eternal hope in Jesus Christ.

“It made me realize just how loved I am by God, and also just a moment of recognizing that, ‘Oh my goodness, the Lord died on the cross for me!’ And who else would possibly be willing to die on the cross for someone else?” Samnang said. They offered her the chance to start teaching *The Greatest Journey* at 14 years old. She was terrified and thrilled by the opportunity—every eye in the room was on her.“ So my prayer during that time was for peace, and recognizing that in those moments, whenever I was feeling nervous or scared, the moment that I would surrender and pray to God, He would give me the strength to make it through,” Samnang said.

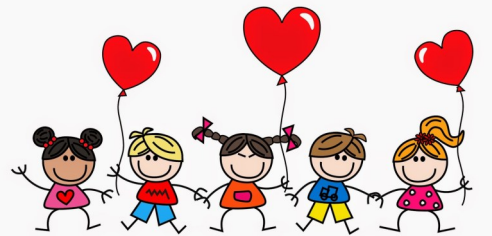
Our Kindergarten class has been building their reading and writing skills and they will keep working on the skills they will need for first grade!

You can bring your items into the classroom next to the elementary kids' classroom or you can put them in the choir room/music library.

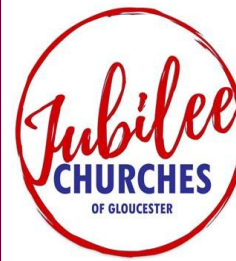
BIG News! Newington Children's Wing is Under Construction!

From the Deacons...Jubilee Churches of Gloucester – January update:

In December, Jubilee Churches (of which Newington is a part of) provided support to **FOUR** homes in our community with \$558. All of those financial requests were with Dominion power assistance. For the year then, Jubilee collectively helped 59 homes with over \$25,000!

Here is just one example of how Newington's Jubilee support was used in November:

Thanks to the generosity of Jubilee Churches, we were able to assist a 70-year-old woman in our Gloucester community who was at risk of losing power in her home. After an unexpected hospital stay and ongoing medication costs, she fell behind on her electric bill. Living with COPD, uninterrupted electricity is essential to her health and safety. Jubilee Churches' support helped prevent a power shutoff, allowing her to remain safely in her home and focus on her health instead of crisis. This assistance provided not only financial relief, but peace of mind and hope during a vulnerable season. Your giving through Newington is helping keep neighbors safe, housed, and cared for—thank you for being part of that impact.

A reminder too, Jubilee works w/ our GUEST ministry. We are hosting GUEST in our Newington gym for a second and final week...beginning **Mon. March 9 – Sun. March 15**.
