## DO YOU HEAR WHAT I HEAR? A WAVE OF CHILDREN!

I hope you have taken time to read through our 2025 Annual Reports. If you have not, I encourage you to pour a cup of coffee (or drink of your choice), get cozy, and reflect with us on our ministry together. In my report, I share how God is calling and inviting us to new life and ministry... but we may not recognize it if we don't listen. I highlighted a number of areas where I hear God calling and would like to share more about one area as we break new ground together for 2026 in children, youth, and family ministry.

On Sunday mornings at Faith, it's hard to miss the sound of children. Did you know we have 22 kids under the age of four and 20 in grade school? If they were all here on a Sunday (think of the Christmas program last December), you couldn't miss them! And then there are our youth. They are loud in different ways... many of them serving through singing, offering music, volunteering in worship, and helping around the church. We are blessed to have many young families in our congregation, and they are spreading the word and inviting their friends. Today's reality is that youth and families are very busy with commitments in many areas. It's normal for them to attend in-person worship less frequently, but that can make it difficult to build relationships with one another and our congregation. We try to offer other opportunities to gather such as Winter Cheer this Sunday, Bible Boot Camp, and Confirmation/Youth nights, and would like to offer more like Vacation Bible School and more regular youth events, but it requires much help to coordinate. As this wave of

children builds and flows forward in the years to come, we want to build and strengthen our ministry to meet their needs, keep them engaged, and draw more families to our church.

I'm excited to share that our Church Council has put together a position description for a Family, Children, and Youth Ministry Coordinator. It is a part time position dedicated to nurturing spiritual growth, fostering engagement, and supporting the holistic development of families, children, and youth at Faith. We want to cultivate meaningful relationships within these families and within our congregation, so that our church can thrive as a network of mutual support, encouragement, and faith. This person would receive a \$1,500 monthly stipend, funded for the first year by our current Youth Ministry Fund and an endowment for ministry support. As this ministry grows, we expect the financial support to grow as well, fully taking on the cost of the position when our mortgage is paid off. Position descriptions are available in the church office and will be shared in the community and through our ELCA synod office. In the coming months, the Council will oversee an interview process, and we hope to have someone serving this position by summer.

If you have questions, reach out to me or any member of our Council and I'll share more at our Annual Meeting on February 8. We welcome your prayerful support and continued financial support for our ministry together. It's such a joy to hear the sound of children at Faith. Listen and give thanks as we also listen for God's direction for the life of our ministry together, today and for years to come.

## **FIRST SUNDAY SCHEDULE**

We continue to offer two worship services on the first Sunday of each month, Contemporary at 9:30 and Traditional at 11:00. Our contemporary service is less structured and incorporates familiar contemporary songs as well as some new to you that you may hear on the radio. The traditional service draws from our rich Lutheran liturgical heritage, incorporating tunes and prayers shared in worship for centuries. The hymns which have stood the test of time, are saturated with Lutheran theology. Each service is a full course meal... consider mixing up your menu and giving one a try.

### **WHAT IS LENT?**

The word “Lent” has a surprising etymology. It comes from the Old English lencten, meaning “spring.” Maybe not surprising considering this liturgical season is home to the first day of Spring and the lengthening of days, but perhaps it refers to another spring as well. Lent is a season of repentance, a time for the law to show us our sin and the gospel to

heal us through God’s grace. Just as farmers spend this season preparing their fields, we are invited to adopt spiritual practices of repentance and mercy. Traditional Lenten practices or disciplines include prayer (spending time in dialogue with God), fasting (giving up excess in your life), and almsgiving (generosity for the sake of others). How will you practice the season of Lent? Join us in some of the ways we make this journey together.

### **Ash Wednesday**

**February 18 - 7:00pm**

Lent is just around the corner! Join us for our traditional service of the imposition of ashes. This practice reminds us that we are dust and to dust we shall return... but also proclaims that we find life in the cross of Christ.

### **LENTEN MIDWEEK WORSHIP**

Throughout the season of Lent, we will gather for Holden Evening Prayer, a beautiful and contemplative liturgy for worship and reflection. Services will be held at 7:00pm on Wednesdays, 2/25, 3/4, 3/11, 3/18, and 3/25. There will be a mission meal at 6:00pm, and the service will last approximately 30 minutes.

### **SERMONS IN LENT - JESUS’ PASSION IN THE GOSPEL OF JOHN**

Since Christmas, we’ve been reading through the Gospel of John, and you may have noticed how different it is from the others. Matthew, Mark, and Luke are referred to as the “synoptic gospels” because they are so similar. Through Lent, we will be reading from chapters 10-20 in the Gospel of John. These chapters tell of Jesus’ Passion (the events leading up to his crucifixion), with some of the stories and theological views being unique to John. Come join us on this Lenten Journey through John’s gospel:

- February 18 - Ash Wednesday - The Good Shepherd (John 10:1-18)
- February 22 - Lent 1 - Jesus Raises Lazarus (John 11:1-44)
- March 1 - Lent 2 - Jesus Washes Feet (John 13:1-17)
- March 8 - Lent 3 - Peter’s Denial (John 18:12-27)
- March 15 - Lent 4 - Jesus and Pilate (John 18:28-40)
- March 22 - Lent 5 - Jesus Condemned (John 19:1-16a)
- March 29 - Palm Sunday - The Crucified Messiah (John 19:16b-22)
- April 2 - Maundy Thursday - Jesus’ Last Words (John 19:23-30)
- April 3 - Good Friday - Jesus the Passover Lamb (John 19:31-42)
- April 5 - Easter Sunday - Resurrection (John 20:1-18)

Through simple storytelling, hands-on activities, and music, our youngest learners (and big-kid helpers) will explore what it means that Jesus is our Good Shepherd and discover the hope found in the story of Lazarus. As the Lenten season begins, we will focus on themes of love, trust, and new life, helping children understand that Jesus is always near, guiding and caring for them.
