A Kingdom of Humble Power (Matthew 21:1-14)

Warmup: If you were to name a kingdom over which you were king or queen, what would you call it?

READ Matthew 21:1-14, Zechariah 9:9

- How would you describe the scene as Jesus enters the gates of Jerusalem with His disciples?
- Why are the crowds shouting “Hosanna” as Jesus enters Jerusalem?
- Jesus’ triumphal entry coincides with the religious celebration of _____.
- As Jesus enters the city, the ESV translation says, the city was “stirred.” The Greek word for stir is seió – “to quake” or “shake.” What factors contribute to the “quaking” amongst the people in the city?

REFLECT

- Jesus’ kingship affects every area of our lives. In what ways is following Jesus currently creating “seismic” change in your life?
- Humility is not thinking less of yourself but thinking of yourself less. In the past few days, how has Jesus been shaping or challenging your humility?
- Humility and power seem like opposites: Allowing Jesus to grow my humility invites His power in my life—what does this process look like in real, everyday terms? Pair-share your answer to the above question with one other person in your Life Group.
