The Lord's Table reminds us that we belong to one another because we belong to Jesus.

At Mountain View Presbyterian Church, we believe that spirit of welcome should extend beyond Sunday mornings. It should shape how we greet visitors, care for one another, serve our community, and prepare for future generations.

Hospitality has always been more than offering coffee and cookies. Biblical hospitality is making room in our hearts, our lives, and our community for those whom God sends our way.

As we continue to pray about the future of our church, may we ask ourselves an important question: ***How can we extend the reach of the King's Table?***

How can we create opportunities for more people to experience the love, grace, friendship, and hope that we have found in Jesus Christ?

This Sunday, during our celebration of Communion, we will also receive commitment cards for the "Let the Little Children Come to Me" Playground and Plaza Project. We invite everyone to continue praying, listening, and seeking God's guidance regarding their participation.

Most importantly, we invite everyone to come to the Table. For at the King's Table there is grace.

At the King's Table there is hope. At the King's Table there is family. And at the King's Table there is always room for one more.

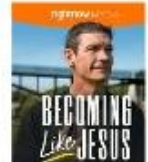
### 7 Habits of a Godly Father

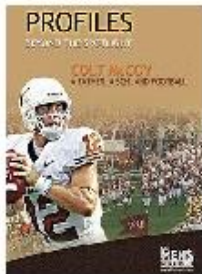


### Becoming Like Jesus

The Christian life is not up and to the right but a lifelong series of highs and lows that the Holy Spirit uses to shape us into people who look like Jesus. In this six-session series, pastor and author Matt Chandler guides us through Jesus's beatitudes found in Matthew 5. As we live out our Christian faith, Jesus develops in us a new way of living so we can be people who reflect God's kingdom.



### Colt McCoy: A Father, A Son, and Football



In the high-stakes, big-money world of NFL football, players who boldly proclaim their faith in Jesus Christ are not the norm. Then again, Colt McCoy is not your typical player. In *Colt McCoy: A Father, A Son, and Football*, the Cleveland Browns' quarterback puts his

service and commitment to God at the front of the line—even when the going gets tough.

In this original Bible study, the father-son dynamic between Brad and Colt is plainly evident, and it's easy to see how a godly father can influence his son to greatness with the simple knowledge that Christ is the cornerstone. "He's thrown thousands of touchdowns and won so many games, of which I am very proud of ... but to see him grow up and influence people in the world for Christ ... no doubt he's doing kingdom work and I am very proud of that," Brad McCoy said.

Throughout this video, interviewer Chris Schneider's questions reveal this father and son's practical Christian faith in action and show how—no matter what the situation—God can be honored through the circumstances in our lives. Schneider is the sports director and morning drive anchor of 1080 KRLD in Dallas, Texas.

# **SESSION MEETINGS HIGHLIGHTS**

Pastor David reported that the meeting regarding the proposed children's play area on Sunday, April 26, was well attended with many good questions and indications of support. The attendance for the three services on Easter Sunday was 672 people.

The Magnify Commission (matters relating to worship). Elder Karla Canfield reported that Holy Week and Easter services went extremely well. The brass quintet for Easter services was an excellent addition and the music department did a wonderful job enhancing the services. The Commission expressed its thanks to Mary Ritzdorf for organizing Sanctuary decorations for Good Friday and Easter. The new baptismal font, revealed on Sunday, April 26, is beautiful and well received. The Commission was very pleased working with Domsy Glass to complete the project. Also on April 26, the Hoving Home choir performance was much appreciated. The Commission is looking into enhancing the back lighting for the cross in the Sanctuary.

The Serve Commission (serving others outside of MVPC). Elder Laura Martin reported that the Sunday, April 26 "Mission Impossible" program highlighting MVPC supported mission partners, was a success. The Commission served lunch to the participants and the Hoving Home choir. The April 19 pet adoption sponsored by the Pet Ministry saw all pets adopted and raised \$300 for the Pet Ministry. The Pet Ministry will sponsor a linen drive in the fall to collect towels and blankets for pet charities. The new Christmas for Shut-ins committee had its first meeting in April and is working to identify people to include in the program. The Commission anticipates an event on Father's Day to collect clothes for Project 150. Food Banks - \$701 was donated by the Men's breakfast crew for the month of April, and Salvation Army food donations for April were estimated at a value of \$3,500. Plans are being finalized for the mission trip to Maui at the end of May and the mission trip to Alaska in June.

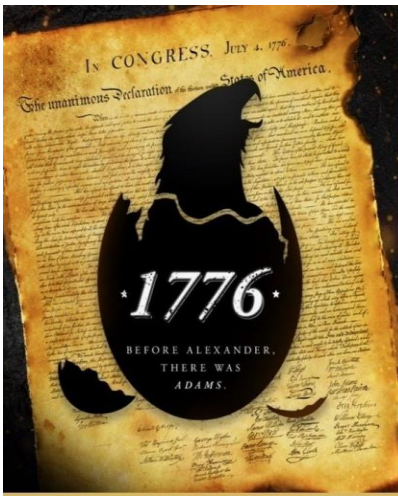
The Nurture Commission (taking care of our congregation). Summer Vacation Bible School plans for July 14-17 are being finalized. The Health Ministry has secured a new defib unit and is planning a first aid training program for the fall. The Spring Fling will be Sunday, May 17 in the afternoon at MVPC. The Bible study programs will be wrapping up in May, replaced by the monthly gatherings over the summer. Sunday, May 31 will be themed "Baseball Sunday."

The Gather Commission (taking care of gatherings in large and small groups) is planning food service for "Comedy for a Cause" at MVPC on May 29.

Stewardship Commission (being good managers of time, talents, and treasures) reported that the Finance Committee will be meeting in May to finalize the budget for the 2026-2027 fiscal year. Elder Al Youmans reported that April saw no major capital expense issues.

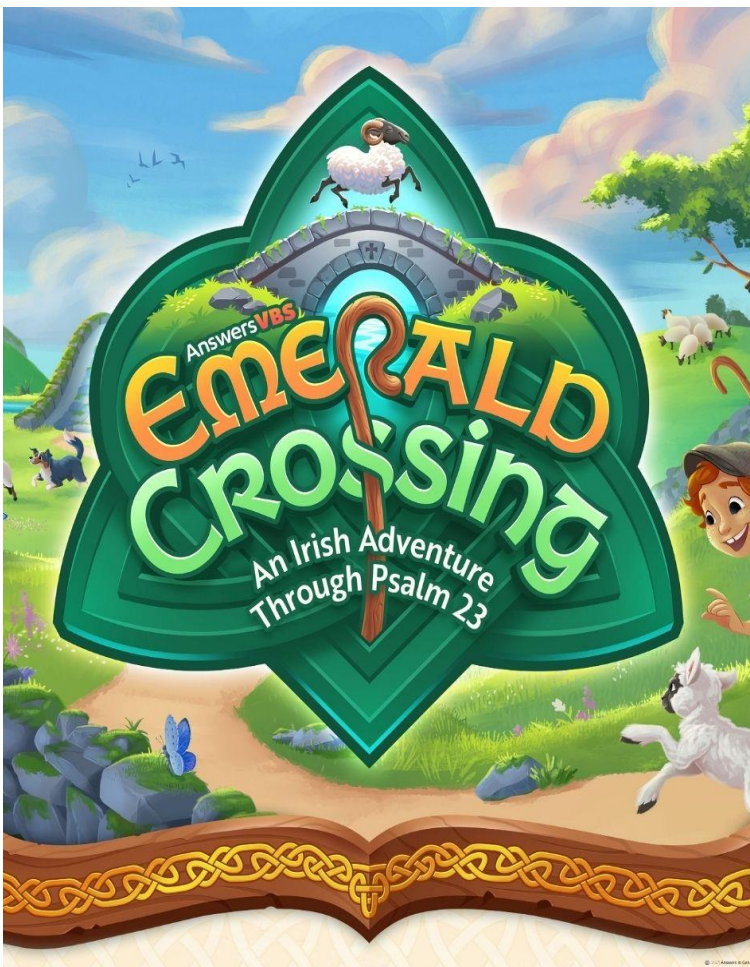
