What is HANAH?

The Huntington Action Network Against Hate (HANAH) is an initiative of the interfaith group Abraham's Table of Long Island. HANAH is built upon Dr. Martin L. King, Jr.'s vision of a Beloved Community where all are respected and welcomed no matter who we are. Sadly, as we work toward that vision, we are periodically confronted with incidents of hate in our town. Working closely with the Huntington Anti-Bias Task Force, HANAH seeks to prevent acts of hate. Congregations will find ways of getting to know each other as we participate in educational programs. Also, we will develop protocols for response to hate incidents. Working with your faith leaders, we'll plan what your congregation can do to support victims of hate incidents.

MISSION OF HANAH

To organize religious congregations within the Town of Huntington to work cooperatively and collaboratively, through inclusion and solidarity, to prevent hate-motivated incidents.

GOALS

1. **EDUCATE:** Provide anti-hate educational programs for and with religious congregations while simultaneously developing interfaith activities that foster inclusion and solidarity against hate.
2. **RESPOND:** Responsibly respond to an act of hate in the Town of Huntington to stand-up and speak-up against hate.
3. **SUPPORT:** Through our congregations, provide counseling and support to victims of hate incidents.

CLUSTERS OF CONGREGATIONS

Congregations of different faiths or denominations, that are in geographical proximity, will join for HANAH activities. A HANAH Ambassador will serve as a liaison from your congregation; she/he will be solicited by your Faith Leader.
