Greetings Good Folks of Trinity,

The weather has certainly changed a lot in the recent weeks: it was just about a month ago that we had a blizzard that canceled Sunday worship services, winds that were hazardous to drive in, and record-setting low temperatures across Iowa; then things warmed up to temperatures in the 70s and in the last week of February I wasn't even wearing a jacket outside. Even in this final few days of February as I'm writing this, the temperatures are set to plummet, people are preparing for the possibility of snow again, and I've gone back to grabbing my warmest winter coat. It can be tough to predict what the weather will be like any given day, and maybe we're somewhat used to that, because lots of life feels that way.

When any group of people get together – whether a congregation or a group of friends making plans for a dinner together – there are a number of factors that can get in the way. Who is going to bring what to that party? When are we supposed to show up? How often will we be doing this? Where are we supposed to park? The list of logistical questions can be enough to even prevent some people from starting. A lot of church websites and other marketing materials even have those “frequently asked questions” section that detail the answers to these types of queries.

At the root of all of those materials though from a church perspective is often the message: “come as you are.” The congregation here at Trinity is often described that way when I talk to new visitors and others. Some might say “it feels like I can belong here because it feels like I’m welcomed just as I am.” We still have a tendency to worry though: what if I’m not dressed quite right? What if I can’t follow along in the bulletin? Will there be anyone who welcomes me at their table in the fellowship hall?

In the Gospel of John, Jesus meets with a devout leader of the Jewish people named Nicodemus who is curious about how Jesus could be doing all these signs that he has accomplished as word is beginning to spread. This discussion eventually leads to one of the most well-known verses in all of Scripture (John 3:16), but in the conversation before it, one of my favorite sayings of Jesus relating to discernment of the Spirit comes to light:

“The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.” – John 3:8, NRSV

We tie ourselves in knots worrying about the details, but often God is right there telling us that we should remember that the important thing is to be present as part of the Body of Christ. As a congregation gathered in the name of the Triune God, we have lots of roles, as we were reminded at February’s installation of the new congregational council:

“There are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.” - 1 Corinthians 12:4-7, NRSV

When we remember through all the changing seasons, blustering winds, and changes that can happen in our congregation that we are gathered in the Love of Christ, the Spirit will guide us into the places that we need to be going, in ways that we may not even understand. I look forward to the sharing of that discernment of the Spirit with all of you in the future.

Council President's Message

Even though it's March it feels like we're in the early stages of another exciting year at Trinity. At February's council meeting we voted on officers for 2024. I will serve another year as President, Al McIlrath has agreed to serve another year as Vice President, and Dane Crist will serve as Secretary for 2024. The President's role is one that I take very seriously, and I appreciate the support and vote of confidence from both the Trinity Council and the congregation as a whole. 2023 was a great year and I believe the same is in store for 2024!

A detail that was overlooked in 2023 and needed to be rectified in 2024 was the underpayment of Pastor Stephen's salary by \$2884.88. If you noticed in the annual report, the Pastoral Salary/Housing/SS Allowance was budgeted at \$60,590 for 2023. Payments were made in the same amount as 2022 (\$57,705.12). A motion was carried to rectify this with a one time lump sum payment. This oversight has been corrected so it will not occur in 2024.

A large part of the February meeting was the discussion of exciting news. . . approval of a formal contract for the new choir director, Chelsea Crumbleholme. By now you have probably met her and see that the choir is spinning up for a performance in the very near future. What a huge accomplishment to get the choir back up and running after so many years! A huge thank you to those that put the recruitment work in to make this happen.

If you recall at the annual meeting there was discussion of putting together an eye-catching landscaping design around the new sign. If this is an important component to you, please keep an eye out for future correspondence. We plan to hold a meeting to gather input and opinions on ideas for what the landscaping should look like. While there will never be complete consensus on a project like this, it is important to keep an open mind and respectfully gather input from everyone interested. There will be more to report as this exciting project moves towards completion. The good news is that the sign can be in and will not be affected by whatever the final landscaping design ends up being.

The Trinity council will be having a 2 hour retreat after service on Sunday, March 24th. This will be a time for us as a council to plan out what we would like to accomplish in 2024 and what we want our future focus to be. It is always a good to spend some time solely devoted to future planning. I look forward to sharing the retreat topics with you in a future Torch article.

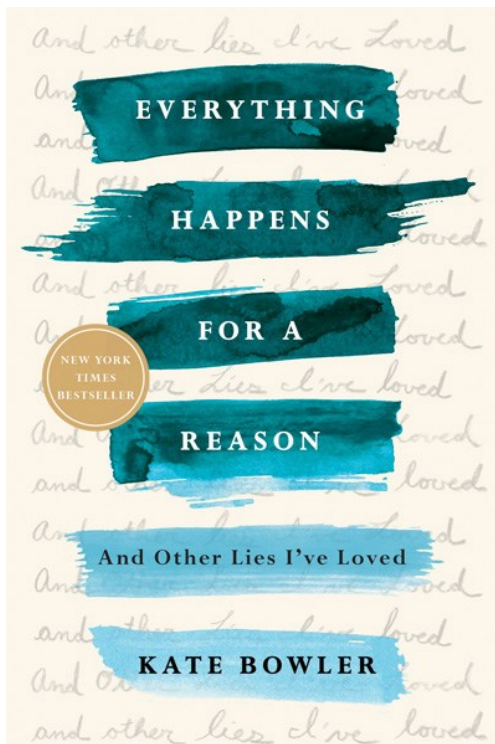

March is National Professional Social Work Month, a time to recognize social workers and thank them for all they do. At Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI), we are grateful for the many social workers who have dedicated their lives to serving our communities across the state!

At LSI, we believe every Iowan deserves the independence they need to thrive. LSI's Host Homes is an innovative way LSI is serving adults with disabilities. Through this program, an individual moves from Supported Community Living into a private family home with a carefully selected mentor. This program is built entirely around an individual's goals and interests, and LSI's extensive matching process ensures the mentor and mentee are a great fit.

Take a moment to read the following story from a Host Homes mentee:

"My journey with LSI's Host Homes started in early 2023. I've known my mentor for a few years while he provided hourly services to me. We learned about Host Homes and thought it would be a good fit for us. I moved into my mentor's home where he helps me maintain a daily routine with schoolwork, household tasks, daily living skills, improving independence, and more.

I attend a college nearby and go to classes a few days a week. I am able to navigate the local bus system to access my community to attend classes and visit friends. My mentor is always available to transport me into the community as needed.

This summer, I went on a trip across the country with one of my classes. While on this trip, I was able to maintain my independence with limited support, but I knew my mentor would be available by phone to assist me with my coping skills and problem solving. This trip was a big success for me knowing I had support only a phone call away.

I like LSI's Host Homes Program because my mentor supports me in the way I want to be supported, assists me with some daily tasks I struggle with, and understands me."

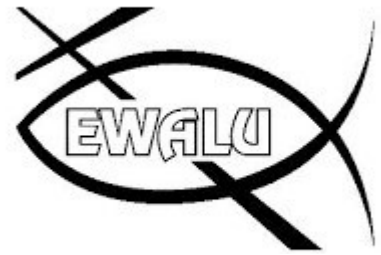

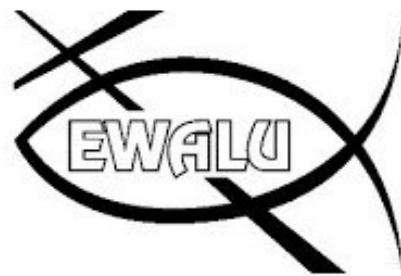

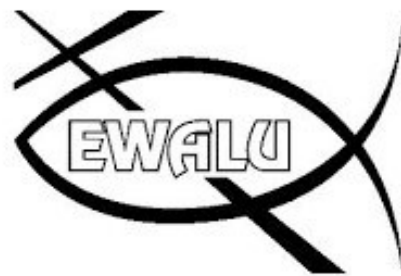
