Greetings to all of you growing in faith,

If you're anything like me, this summer you have watched in amazement as the corn and beans around Iowa have sprung up incredibly quickly. I'll save it to those with a bit more experience in farming to say why, but it's always been one of my favorite times of year to see the crops getting ready for harvest. I have heard it said that you can even hear the corn growing when you're out in the field.

All around me these days, it feels like I am hearing growth. My daughter, Leslie, becomes more and more chatty as she continues learning and getting excited for our next baby to come along in October. Leah and I listen and watch with anticipation when we go to the appointments to learn more about the progress of pregnancy. Here at church, it is always a blessing to hear a quick word in the line after worship of the way a sermon impacted you, or hearing laughter of folks at a weekly Bible Study, or enjoying the look of a child who's faith is growing right in front of me.

In Psalm 85, we read a similar message:

*"Steadfast love and faithfulness will meet; righteousness and peace will kiss each other. Faithfulness will spring up from the ground, and righteousness will look down from the sky." (Ps. 85:10-11, NRSVue)*

Faithfulness will **spring up**! This is good news for all of us! This happens not through our work alone but through the work of God. When God's steadfast love and faithfulness meet, it brings together righteousness and peace to a kiss. The fruits of God's work in all of us are the continued faithfulness that we can observe springing up in various ways.

The Holy Spirit is given as a gift to us by God to abide with us, grant us a trust we may place in Christ who has come near, showering God's love on us in his death on the cross and resurrection. We respond to that grace by sharing that grace with others around us – almost like love pollinating all around us. To slightly alter another common farming phrase: "grace rolls downhill." We see this all around us in the ways people reach out to one another in comfort and support in times of need, in the many ways our congregation supports the community around us, and in sharing the love of Christ with all our neighbors.

May we share the goodness of this as we head into another fall season ahead. To return to the psalm I cited earlier, "Surely his salvation is at hand for those who fear him, that his glory may dwell in our land." (Psalm 85:9, NRSVue). We give thanks for all the ways that God's greatness is made known in our lives, in our world, and in our church.

Greetings in Christ from your Trinity Church Council,

We had a busy meeting agenda for the July Council meeting, including discussion on a request to rent our building by another startup church, updates from Property on upcoming maintenance projects, a request from John Newman for monetary support of his plan to revitalize the butterfly garden, and continued updates and discussion on long-term planning on such projects as the potential kitchen remodel. Pastor and I gave a brief update on the successful VBS week.

In regards, to the startup church request, Council felt we did not have quite enough information to make the most informed decision at this time. We as a congregation need to make some strides in determining potential costs for renting out various parts of the church for a wide range of activities and services in a fair manner that also covers us in case of any damages or liability for use of our facilities. We also need to have a clear policy that is fair for congregation members as well as outside entities. So, stay tuned as there is more discussion to come.

Property has been busy with some life safety issues, mainly dealing with decisions surrounding a couple of very dangerously, rotted-out trees and a recent fire department inspection report that had a few things that needed to be addressed, most of which were very minor and easily fixed.

Council voted to support the Butterfly Garden revitalization with money to help with some of the costs for seeds/plants/supplies in regard to a request from John Newman. We placed this ministry under Social Ministry and will allow up to \$500 from Social Ministry budget to be used for the Butterfly Garden. Taking care of God's Creation and encouraging pollinators like butterflies and bees is a tenant of Social Ministry that might not immediately come to mind when we first think about all the things that go under the Social Ministry heading.

The kitchen remodel discussion had input surrounding how best to plan for the future use of the kitchen with an aging congregation and many are approaching the plan from the standpoint of planning on accessibility. Even in recent years, many of our members and visitors that use our facilities use walking canes, walkers, wheelchairs, etc. Wouldn't it be nice if there was plenty of space for those people to continue to serve and enjoy fellowship with ease in accessibility, to continue to bring smiles to others in cheerful service?

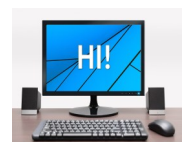

## SOME BUZZ

### DID YOU KNOW?

1. The vast majority of all Monarch Butterflies are found in North America. Most North American Monarchs are found east of the Rocky Mountains. They are called the Eastern Monarchs.

2. The Eastern Monarch is known for its epic annual migration from its summer breeding grounds in the midwestern United States and southern Canada to overwintering sites in the mountains of central Mexico. The approximate 3,000 mile journey takes place late summer into autumn.

3. The Monarch generation that migrates to Mexico is a super generation that completes the entire trip, living up to nine months. After overwintering in Mexico, in spring each year the Monarchs return north. It takes several generations to complete this trip, as each generation lives only 2-6 weeks.

4. The Eastern Monarch is the only butterfly species that migrates as it does. Iowa is in the Monarch's migration core. It is estimated that about 40% of all Monarchs fly to, through, or from, Iowa and adjoining Midwestern states.

5. For the somewhat superstitious, a Monarch Butterfly landing on your shoulder is said to be a sign of coming good fortune.

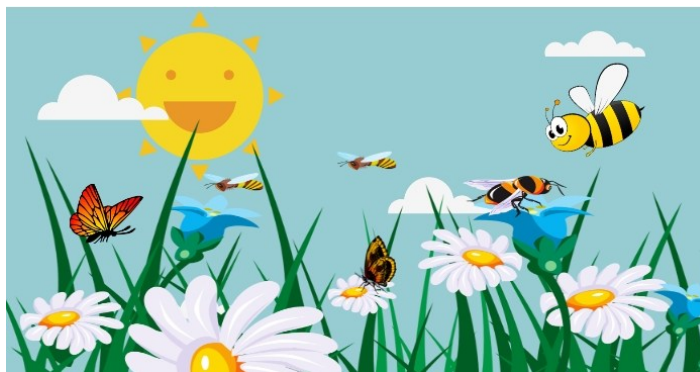
6. From the year 2000 to 2024, the worldwide population of Monarch Butterflies has declined from an estimated one billion to about 34 Million. Wide use of pesticide and loss of natural habitat are identified as the primary causes of the dramatic decline.

7. The abrupt decline in the Monarch Butterfly's population is one reason it is now a symbol of concern for the loss of numerous species of insect pollinators.

8. The Iowa DNR assesses that over 20% of all pollinator species native to Iowa (over 120 different species, including the Monarch and the American Bumble Bee) face an elevated risk of extinction. Where practical, the DNR encourages landowners to establish pollinator gardens as part of its program to restore native prairie for the benefit of these pollinators.

9. For the economic-minded, The US Department of Agriculture estimates that bees, butterflies and other insect pollinators contribute about \$30 Billion to our agricultural economy each year. Some scientists suggest that one out of every three bites of the food we consume, are attributed to insect pollinators.

**10. If it's all too dramatic, relax and have a cup of coffee. But consider, the coffee plant is one of many food-source plants pollinated almost exclusively by bees, butterflies, and some birds.**

## August Church Update 2025

### **Your Support makes this Testimony possible A New Beginning: Carmen's Journey to Safety and Self-Reliance**

Carmen Ortiz was born in Charco, Nariño, Colombia. At 11, her family relocated to Buenaventura, where she finished high school and watched her father build a small business. Violence in the region forced the family to move again — this time to Bogotá, in search of safety and stability.

In Bogotá, Carmen reconnected with a childhood friend who would become her life partner. Together, they launched Frutería, a fruit-selling business Carmen successfully operated for 17 years. During that time, she also became a mother to her son, Adiel Jesús.

In 2023, violence once again disrupted their lives. Fearing for their safety, Carmen and Adiel fled to Ecuador and applied for asylum through the International Organization for Migration (IOM). Life in Ecuador was grueling.

"We were homeless. I had to sleep with my son under a bridge," she recalls. "He got sick and had to be hospitalized."

After more than a year, IOM helped process their immigration status and arranged travel to the U.S. In July 2024, they arrived in Houston — exhausted, hungry, and unsure of what came next. The guide assigned to help them was rarely available. Desperate for help and food, Carmen approached airline staff to ask about a delayed flight.

"We were so hungry. I just wanted to know when our flight would leave and instead, three employees brought us full meals. I started to cry. I had just arrived, and people were already helping me."

Their flight to Des Moines departed at midnight and landed at 2 a.m., where they were welcomed by Chuck, a caseworker from LSI (Lutheran Services in Iowa). He brought them to a hotel, where Carmen remembers feeling overwhelmed.

"I was scared and confused. I remember thinking: Are we safe? Are we okay?"

Sixteen days later, LSI helped Carmen and Adiel move into their first apartment. From that point, life began to change. Carmen enrolled in English classes, received assistance with legal paperwork, healthcare, and food — and soon found two jobs: one with Des Moines Public Schools, and another at Sam's Club.

"I'm incredibly grateful. LSI helped me with everything."

But life without a car in a Midwestern winter was difficult. Carmen walked long distances through the snow, waited for buses, or spent \$60 a week on rideshares, just to get to work and get her son to school. During a routine check-in, Carmen's caseworker Shaima heard about these challenges and referred her to Duaa, an IDA Specialist at LSI. Duaa introduced her to the matched savings program, which helps participants purchase essential assets — like a car — through financial education and support.

"I'd wake up my son very early so we could catch the school bus from our old address. Then I'd rush to work and still be late."

Carmen had already saved \$2,000 on her own, knowing a car would be vital for her family's stability. Through LSI's Individual Development Accounts program, she opened an account at Veridian Credit Union, completed budgeting and asset-specific classes, and received one-on-one coaching from Juan Lourido, Business Development Specialist at LSI. Juan helped her understand financing, credit, and how to identify reliable used cars online. With his help, Carmen purchased a safe, fuel-efficient 2015 Toyota Prius that fits her family's needs and budget. "I never thought I could buy a car especially one that was safe and good quality. Now I take my son to school and go to work. That means everything to me."

She also opened a secured \$500 credit card to begin building her credit history.

"These classes helped me prepare for when income slows down in the summer. I feel independent now, especially with the car."

Today, Carmen is preparing for her driving test, building a new life, and planning for the future.

"When we left Colombia, we were running from threats and violence. Now I'm getting used to a new life, looking for opportunities to grow, maybe buy a house, and support my son's education."

When asked to describe her journey in one word, she answers without hesitation:

"Apoyo" — Support.

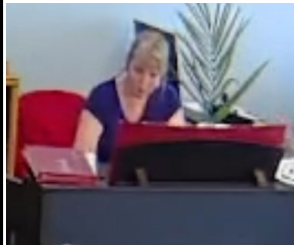
