The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ,
the love of God,
and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you!

This familiar greeting comes to us from Paul's second letter to the Corinthians, and unites us in a theology of the Trinity, and as such is used many times on Holy Trinity Sunday (this year, May 31). You also might recognize from the beginning of every regular worship service here at Trinity - and at many other liturgical churches. Another reading from that Sunday is often the Genesis account of creation, and while we might think that we've heard that all before, I invite you to open up a Bible and read that first chapter of Genesis again from time to time and see what the Spirit of God is stirring in you as you read it again.

"The earth was complete chaos, and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. Then God said, 'Let there be light,' and there was light." - Genesis 1:2-3, NRSVUE

Out of chaos, God brings forth order. Even as a pastor, it is often hard for me to remember that. When a week feels like it has a never-ending supply of meetings, visits, drop-ins at my office, phone calls, and more, it can feel chaotic, but when I am at my best, I will remind myself, that out of the chaos, God spoke an orderly creation into being.

Maybe you've seen this in your own lives as well: when a family member dies, those left to grieve often feel like they are in the midst of chaos, and sometimes I even hear from them that the funeral worship gave some order to the whole chaotic time. When we see children running around and shouting with joy as they form faith and have fun at our day camp this summer, I hope we can remember that God creates order in the time of complete chaos. What other examples in your life is there order in a time of chaos?

When our council last met, we discussed the importance of clarity in a direction for where we are going. I have also recently been speaking with my clergy coach about this notion, and whether it is personal or as part of a community, prayer and discernment always seem to bring us back to what matters most. In our congregational context, I tend to also remind myself of the orderly work of the Call Committee that was a part of the process in bringing me here to Trinity to serve. In that process, there is a document called a Ministry Site Profile (MSP) that shares a lot about who the congregation is, what they are about, what challenges they see, and where they might like to go in the future. It also brings forth the mission statement of a congregation, and I often return to it when I want some order in a chaotic time. It reads:

"We are bound in Christian love to strengthen and nurture all through the word and sacraments as we work, reach out and serve in this community."

Perhaps you read that, and it makes perfect sense: you look at everything that our church does, and you can draw a direct line back to that statement. Maybe you look at that statement, and you wish it had some refining: the words sound good, but is it catchy? There's also the possibility that it is "clear as mud," and for those people I would love to discuss more about what can bring more clarity there. In whatever way we view our congregation's mission statement, may we continue to work onward, looking toward a God who we can trust creates order in the midst of chaos.

The warm weather has finally arrived, and I am sure everyone's schedules are quickly filling up with vacations, graduations, yard work, gardening, and much more. Pastor, Michelle, and I recently went to the Synod Assembly where Bishop Amy Current was re-elected as our Bishop for 6 more years. In a previous Synod Assembly, there were term limits imposed so this will be her last term as Bishop. She won with over 75% of the vote on the first ballot, which is very impressive.

While at the assembly, we also heard about members of our Synod Council, messages from our sister synods in Africa, and we heard quite a bit about how the Synod is spending the money we send them, as well as how it is used in the greater ELCA. I can tell you that I have noticed quite a tightening of our Synod budget over the years, as they often will use a church for the assembly now instead of renting a conference center. The food supplied is much simpler and affordable, and they recently eliminated an Assistant to the Bishop who handled Marketing and Media which was replaced by an outside contractor at a considerable savings of thousands of dollars. So, just like our member churches, the Synod Council is learning to do more with less.

Michelle and I are hopeful that someone will take on being the voting members for the next assembly because you learn so much about our Synod and ELCA that you can apply here at Trinity. Since the next ones won't have a Bishop election, they will probably be 1-day events. We had many conversations with members from other churches like ours experiencing some of the same struggles, and we also heard some very interesting ideas on how to succeed.

Lastly, I wanted to recognize a graduate that you may not see a lot in church on Sundays, but who is consistently here serving our church and community. Ben Kathan, son of Don Kathan, has been serving in the Food Pantry since we started it. He started out doing his mandatory service hours for PV High School along with his brother Jay, but both of them have fulfilled their service requirements and have stayed on helping in the pantry. Ben graduated from PV in May. If you happen to see him (or his brother), thank them for their continued service in the Pantry and congratulate Ben on his High School Graduation.

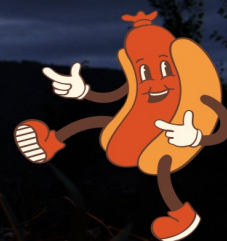
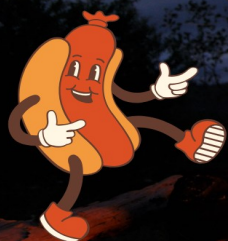

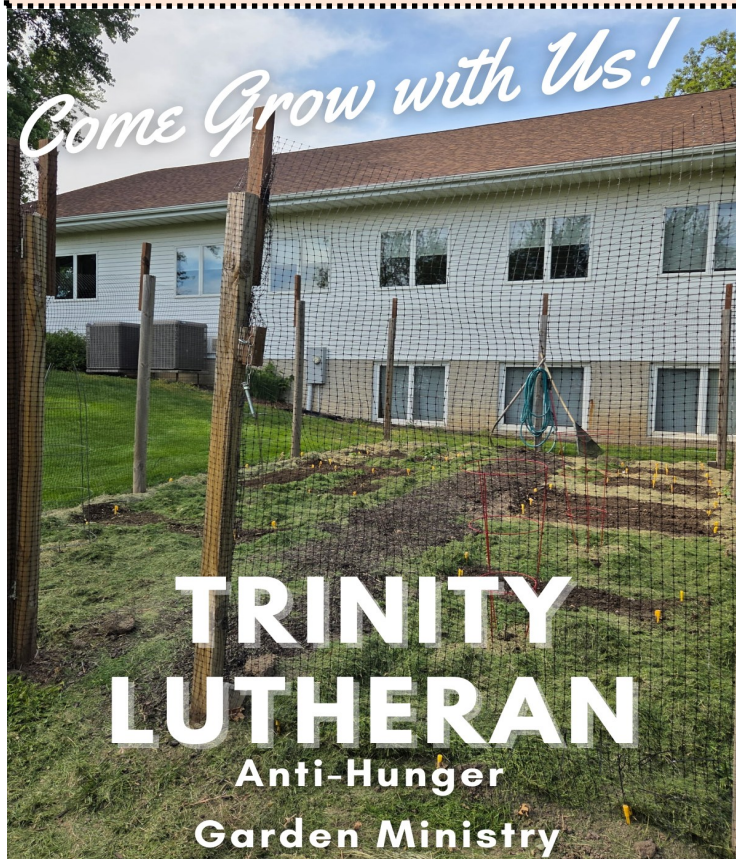
FOOD PANTRY NEEDS

In June, we'll meet at The Tangled Wood in Bettendorf, and possibly be outside, if weather permits.

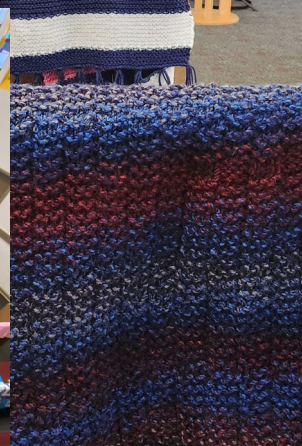
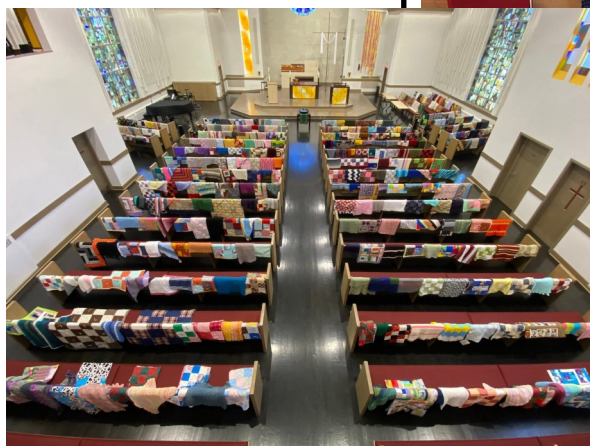
Wrapped in Prayer: Prayer Shawls and Quilts Join Synod Assembly to Be Sent to SE Iowa Organizations

We give thanks for the three prayer shawls and one lap quilt donated by members of Trinity Lutheran Church, and these joined the hundreds of others from around the synod in being sent forth to local organizations that support people who need their warmth.

One such organization is based in Cedar Rapids: Matthew 25, and they have used the lesson of Matthew 25 to meet Christ in their midst in numerous ways.

Thank-you for showing that Trinity is part of such a wonderful larger church movement, bringing hope to those in need.





ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE SEEKS DISBURSEMENT RECIPIENTS FOR 2026

In 2025, Trinity Endowment Fund was able to distribute \$19,000 to various agencies within the ELCA and our community. Many of our recipients were recommended by members of the congregation. This year we will be distributing \$20,000 and would like to hear your suggestions for organizations that could benefit. The Endowment Agreement stipulates the following guidelines for distribution:

20% (\$4000)	to Trinity's Council Discretionary Fund
20% (\$4000)	to ELCA Affiliated Programs
20% (\$4000)	to Community Service Programs
40 % (\$8000)	to Miscellaneous Organizations

Monica never imagined she would become a mother.

After a childhood marked by trauma, the devastating loss of her sibling to violence, and years spent in turbulent foster care settings, she made a quiet promise to herself: she would never bring a child into a world that had caused her so much pain. But life has a way of opening doors we never expect. In her thirties, alongside her husband Tim, Monica found herself preparing to welcome a baby girl. Even then, fear and uncertainty lingered.

When Monica heard about LSI's free community baby shower in Le Mars, she hesitated. Social gatherings often triggered her anxiety, but something told her to take a chance. That decision would change everything.

At the event, Monica met Angie, a Family Support Specialist who immediately made her feel safe, seen, and supported. For the first time, Monica felt like she didn't have to navigate motherhood alone. Encouraged by that connection, she took a leap of faith and enrolled in LSI's HOPES (Healthy Opportunities for Parents to Experience Success) program. Soon after, baby Lily was born, and with her came a love that transformed everything.

Today, Monica and Tim eagerly welcome Angie into their home each week. Together they are building the kind of family Monica once believed was out of reach. Monica soaks up every parenting resource she can, applying what she learns with determination and care. Tim is a steady, patient presence. And Lily? She is a joyful, thriving toddler growing exactly as she should be.

But Monica's journey didn't begin with confidence. It began with a single moment of courage and an agency that showed up for her. Because of that one event, Monica found more than support, she found belief in herself. She found the tools to heal, to grow, and to become the loving, capable mother she once thought she could never be.

Stories like Monica's are only possible because of compassionate donors.

Community support makes it possible to host community baby showers that connect families to vital resources. It funds programs like HOPES that empower parents, strengthen families, and give children the safe, nurturing start they deserve.

And Monica's story is just one example of many.
