Bible School Course Descriptions
Fall/Spring Semester 2026-2027

Bible Survey

This course provides a survey of the entire Bible, covering both the Old and New Testaments through a book-by-book approach. Students will study the key characters, significant events, and major themes of each book while examining their relationship to the chronological sequence of biblical history.

General Bible I (Pre-requisite Bible Survey)

This course provides a study of the Old and New Testaments with emphasis on the divine nature and redemptive work of God, biblical covenants and dispensations. Students will also explore biblical typology and the principles of homiletics, equipping them to interpret Scripture accurately and communicate God's Word effectively.

General Bible II (Pre-requisite General Bible I)

This course introduces the study of predictive prophecy through an in-depth examination of the Old Testament prophets and their prophetic messages. Students will explore the Law, the Writings, and the Psalms to gain a deeper understanding of God's redemptive plan and the fulfillment of biblical prophecy. The course also includes an introduction to Systematic Theology, providing a foundational framework for understanding, interpreting, and applying biblical doctrine.

Post Graduate I (Pre-requisite General Bible II)

This course provides an in-depth examination of comparative religions. Students will also explore the origins of the Bible, the relationship between Science and the Bible, and the historical development of the Christian Church through an interpretive study of Church History. The course concludes with an introduction to Eschatology I, examining the foundational biblical teachings concerning future events and God's prophetic plan.

Post Graduate II (Pre-requisite Post Graduate I)

This course provides a study of Eschatology II, including an exegetical examination of the Book of Revelation and its prophetic teachings. Students will explore the doctrines of Soteriology and Theism, gaining a deeper understanding of biblical teachings concerning salvation, the nature and attributes of God, and their significance within the broader framework of Christian theology.

Teacher's Training I (Post Graduate II)

This course provides an introduction to the foundational principles of Christian education and effective teaching. Students will explore basic concepts in psychology, pedagogy, Daily Vacation Bible School (DVBS), administration, curriculum development, and advanced teaching techniques designed to enhance instructional effectiveness.

Teacher's Training II (Pre-requisite Teacher's Training I)

This course is designed to prepare students for effective teaching across various educational levels. Students will examine the application of learning theories to teaching methodologies through practical demonstrations and classroom experiences. Coursework will include the development of lesson presentations, effective Bible teaching strategies, creative classroom methods, and opportunities for hands-on teaching practice. Emphasis will be placed on integrating biblical principles with sound educational practices to equip students for impactful ministry and instruction.

Spiritual Warfare

The Unseen War Is Real. But Our Victory Is Already Secured in Jesus Christ.

This course explores the reality of spiritual warfare and the enemy's strategies against our faith, families, peace, and spiritual lives. Students will discover what the Bible teaches about Satan, his battlefield, the believer's armor, and our authority in Christ. Most importantly, we will learn how to stand firm and walk in the victory Jesus Christ has already secured through His finished work on the cross—and much more.

Soul Winning

This course examines the biblical significance of becoming an effective soul winner and the believer's responsibility in sharing the message of salvation through Jesus Christ. Students will explore the distinction between a soul winner and a witness, the qualifications necessary for effective evangelism, and the role of God's power in leading the unregenerated man toward the saving knowledge of Christ. The course will also address the importance of prayer, the authority given to believers, and the impact of maintaining spiritual fellowship with God. In addition, students will study various religious cults and sects while gaining practical principles and essential strategies for successful soul winning.

The Parables of Jesus

In this course, we will study the profound parables of Jesus, which serve as both a mirror and a window—a mirror that reflects each student's own life and a window that offers a glimpse into God's divine perspective.

As we embark on this journey of discovering and uncovering the timeless wisdom found in Jesus' teachings, we will be inspired to apply godly principles in our daily lives.

The Book of First Corinthians

This course provides an in-depth study of Paul's First Epistle to the Corinthians, examining the challenges faced by the early church and the biblical solutions provided for spiritual restoration and growth. After leaving Corinth, where Paul had founded the church of Corinthians, Paul received disturbing reports concerning pride, sexual immorality, the improper exercise of spiritual gifts and misunderstandings of key Christian doctrines. Through the study of Paul's letter to the church of Corinthians, we will learn how a fallen church can be restored back to its foundation — Jesus Christ.

Revealing The Mysteries of Heaven

This course will answer and clarify the most important questions Christians have about their future eternal home. If you had questions about heaven, this course will help you close the gap between what the Bible says about heaven and what you know. We will pull the curtain back, to the extent Scripture allows, to reveal the glorious and utterly amazing realm of heaven. It will transform your perspective here on earth!

Twelve Prominent Men of The Bible

In this course, we will examine the ways in which Jesus shaped His Disciples to achieve greatness. We will learn from Jesus' teachings on how we, too, can be used to carry out His mission throughout the world.

Twelve Extraordinary Women of the Bible

In this course, we will examine the lives of twelve remarkable women. Among those we will study are: >Rahab: A Life of Redemption >Anna: The Devoted Witness >Mary Magdalene: A Woman Delivered From Darkness. From these women, along with others, we will glean from their experiences. These ordinary women encountered the same challenges that we face today, yet despite their struggles and temptations, they remained faithful to God. Through the power of God, their lives were transformed and today, they are regarded as the twelve Extraordinary Women of God.

Child/Youth Evangelism Courses

These Courses are designed to give a simplistic approach to learning the Bible which includes learning scriptures and understanding God's plan of salvation.

Child Evangelism I - This course is designed for children between the ages of 4-14.

Child Evangelism II - This course is designed for children between the ages of 15-17.
