Let Gratitude be your Attitude By Pastor Adam


Every time November rolls around, a melancholy mood descends on me. I find great joy in the changing colors of the leaves and the cooling temperatures, but they inevitably bring me back to

my dad who died on November 6, 2010. As I point out at every funeral at which I preside, death is a mix of grief and celebration. I continue to grieve the unique emptiness of my dad's absence and the missed opportunities of my children to know their PaPa. But I also celebrate with confidence the assurance of God's promise of eternal life.

It's in the midst of this grief and celebration that every year I also reflect on one of the greatest gifts my dad gave me... gratitude. He was the kind of guy that always found the silver lining. He always found a reason to be thankful, even

to his last breath. Perhaps it was because Thanksgiving fell on his birthday, November 23, every now and again. Not only did it mean that there would be candles in the pumpkin pie, but it may have altered his DNA a bit, giving him a gratitude gene.

When each of his grandkids was confirmed, he would give them a copy of a tiny book, "Always We Begin Again: The Benedictine Way of Living" by John McQuiston II. It's a contemporary take on the rule of St. Benedict, a monk of the 5th Century. He



is known as "the father of monasticism" and the Rule that he established became the norm for monastic living throughout Europe. What is the foundation of this simple yet incredibly influential way of living? Gratitude.

St. Benedict ordered his day around gratitude, actually scheduling times that he would pause, give thanks, and

worship. I've heard it said that you can't think yourself into a new way of acting, but you can act yourself into a new way of thinking. Think about the impact that cultivating a discipline of gratitude can have on your life. What would happen if the first words on your lips each morning were gratitude? What would happen if your phone buzzed every couple of hours to remind you to give thanks? Sure it wouldn't be so hard in the easy times, but what if it has been a rough day? What if you feel beat up by the world? What if gratitude is the farthest thing from your mind? Try it. I dare you. Be grateful.

Let gratitude be your attitude. I now it's cliché. There are times when I may have wanted to slap the person who told me that (maybe I'd better avoid you all for a few days!). Be grateful, but don't stop there. Be sure to give credit where credit is due. Be grateful to God! Give thanks to the One who is the source of every blessing. Give thanks to the One who is always faithful. Give thanks to the One who is the source of all life. When we are grateful, each day, each moment, is a new beginning. When we are grateful to God, always we begin again.

Our youth remind us that they are capable and called to lead in a variety of ways. Come and support their efforts and hear about our 2023 goal to grow our youth ministry.




Commitment Sunday and Music Celebration November 20


Our Fall Small Group ministry is underway! Here are some pictures of what happened this last month; put the dates for upcoming events on your calendars.

Jacksonville Food Center

Demand and supply for food is suffering as the world problems funnel down. New families have been coming to the Food Center for help. Since February, 91 new families were added as needing help. 50 additional food boxes were prepared in one week.

Blessings have also been gathered. Upon the closing of Community Christian Church, \$10,000 was donated to the Jacksonville Food Center. \$1,400 was donated from five civic groups. Blue Cross-Blue Shield donated 150 pounds of food. At K's Creek Golf Club, the 3rd Annual Hot Wings Charity Challenge will donate all money from the proceedings to the Food Center.

Statistics for September: The Food Center served 176 families (434 people) at a cost of \$22,560. 277 families (488 people) were served for extra bakery/produce at a cost of \$4,280. The cost of meat for bakery/produce customers was \$964.

The churches contributed \$2,029.03 in money and \$1,007.50 in food donations. Our Faith Lutheran Church donated \$220 in September. Besides much-needed money donations, foods such as dry pasta, mac and cheese, canned vegetables, canned soups, and cereal are also welcome.
