

A Gift of God's Grace

Last month I received the worst phone call I'd ever received in my life. While we were over a thousand miles away in Florida, my mom had died instantly of a ruptured aortic aneurism at the breakfast table with friends at her independent living facility. Thus began a journey of many miles and many tears as we made our way home to grieve with family and friends.

The next days were filled with so many unexpected emotions. I knew I would miss my mom, but not this much. I knew I would need the support of

others, but not this much. Words can't express how much your love and prayers have meant to me. Thank you!

I also didn't realize how badly I needed to be with my Faith Family. If you heard the sermon at my mom's funeral, you know she loved communion. She came to church hungry every Sunday. She couldn't wait to come to

the table, extend her hands, and receive the grace of God offered in the body of Christ. It was meaningful to her also that it was an open table, open to all who were hungry in this life and all who have gone before us into eternal life. Every week, at Holy Communion, she knew she was eating with my dad.

On Ash Wednesday, back here in Jacksonville with you all, something else unexpected happened during Holy Communion... not in the receiving, but in the giving. Moments before, I had looked each of you in

the eye, smeared ash on your foreheads in the shape of a cross, and told you, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Then, in Holy Communion, I looked beneath the shadow of the cross and into your eyes, placed the body of Christ in your hands, and proclaimed, "The Body of Christ, given for you." Each exchange brought healing and a gift of God's grace. It was glorious!

Since then, I have reflected in prayer and realize how important it is for me to do what I am called to do with people I love. I'm called to be a husband and father, and so I need to take time to be with Karen and our kids as we grieve together. I am called to be a

> pastor, your pastor of Word and Sacrament, and so I delight in proclaiming the gospel, splashing in baptismal waters, and sharing in the body of Christ with you. I am called to be a Child of God, and so I need to be who I am, feel what I feel, and let God carry me.

> Life gets busy, and it's often hard to take time to do what we are called to do with the people

we love, but my mom's death puts things into perspective for me. I'm grateful for every time I put the busyness of life aside to be with her, and for the opportunity to live out my calling as husband, father, and pastor.

How is God calling you? In what ways are you called to serve with people you love? In what ways can you serve here at Faith with your Faith Family? Life is short. Answer your call. Seize your opportunities to serve. And come to the table.

Sunday Mornings in Lent: "Lessons Learned"

Our gospel readings during Lent lead us through some challenging parables of Jesus. Time and time again, he confronts us, challenging our notions of God and neighbor. Each week we will learn more about God and about ourselves as we hear these stories of forgiveness, generosity, community, judgement, and seeing Christ in our neighbor. We will also be introducing a portion of a new liturgy from the hymnal, Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW). It is an upbeat liturgy to lead us through Lent as we sing, "Kyrie Eleison - Lord have Mercy." Each week we will also take time for reflection as we sing a Taizé song from the previous Wednesday night. Taizé music is simple and repetitive as it provides time and pace for meditation and prayer.

Lenten Midweek Supper and Worship Services "Open My Life, Lord"

It's time for Lenten midweek soup and worship! Suppers are potluck style. Come at 6:00 in the Great Room, and bring a dish to share. If your day is busy, come and eat, knowing that the gift you bring is yourself! Worship begins at 6:45 and will follow the Holden Evening Prayer format. Our theme is "Open My Life, Lord" as each week looks at a different way God opens us to deeper faith. The "body prayer" engages our whole bodies and a Taizé song draws us deeper into prayerful meditation. You won't want to miss these wonderful opportunities for fellowship and worship as we gather together as the body of Christ!

During our Midweek Worship Services, we will explore the following themes:

Week 1: "Open My Eyes, Lord" - How does our world change when we view it through the eyes of Christ?

Week 2: "Open My Hands, Lord" - How are our hands used in service to others?

Week 3: "Open My Ears, Lord" - How can we grow from hearing to listening?

Week 4: "Open My Heart, Lord" - How can an open heart increase our willingness and trust?

Week 5: "Open My Life, Lord" - It is no longer we who live, but Christ who lives in us!


It's a new year with new opportunities for Small Groups! Check these out and consider how you might get involved..

Mission Trip to Uganda - March 8-23

It's finally here! Our team of six is off to Uganda! After a flight that will take them through Amsterdam and Tanzania, they will arrive in Kampala, Uganda and spend nine days with the children and leaders of Pillars of Africa orphanage and school. They will worship with Patrick and his congregation, serve by installing electricity in the school, play with the children, build relationships with the kids and staff, prayerfully discern ways to grow this ministry, and much more that only God knows! Their trip will conclude with an opportunity to experience the wild beauty of Africa through a safari in Merchison Falls National Park and headwaters of the Nile River.

covered the cost of the mission portion of their trip, the electrical installation for the school, and is providing gifts of food, clothing, medical supplies, and more. It is truly our entire congregation on this journey together!

Jacksonville Food Center

Melissa, Food Center Director, is working on an application for a \$30,000 grant that may be used for any expense except payroll. The weekly pick-up of donations from Aldi and Walmart are once again happening. There was one new person every day last week for food boxes, which are available to families twice a month. Produce, bakery, and meats (once a week availability) has lately been busier than the food boxes.

Looking into the future, a decrease in Food Stamps to pre-pandemic levels will happen in March. The Food Center expects a big increase in requests for extra foods. Add to that, the end of school in summer also increases the need for extra food.

The Food Center served 183 families for food boxes, totaling 459 people, at a cost of \$23,795. They served 172 families for extra bakery and produce, a total of 363 people at a cost of \$2,915. The meat cost for the bakery-produce customers was \$696. In January, the churches donated \$2,435 in food and \$2,536 in money. *Lillian Korous*

Plastic Caps & Lids

Do you know about all those caps we've been collecting? We found a source to make them into a bench for us... maybe two! Keep bringing your caps and lids to the Mission & Ministry Center/coat closet at Faith. We also need helpers willing to sort (and possibly wash) them and weigh them before we take them for drop-off.

End-of-Year Giving 2023

At the 2023 Annual Meeting, our congregation approved the donation of \$15,000 to be given from endowment interest for the glory of God and benefit of all God's children.
