When we landed in Uganda, there was no doubt that we weren't in Illinois anymore. It was approaching midnight, the airport was nearly empty, and the hot, humid air washed over us. We made it through immigration and customs without a hitch, and then, when we walked outside, we were greeted with clapping and screaming from an elated welcome party who smothered us in hugs. Our ears strained to understand everyone. English is the national language of Uganda, but each spoke it with their own dialect and accent. Then came the drive... oh the drive! In Uganda, cars don't follow one another in order, they swarm and swell all over the place like a school of fish, taking any open bit of spare pavement or dirt, swerving out of the way for oncoming traffic at the last second. We drove through the dark, unable to see the landscape and community around us, but so aware that it was something we had never seen or experienced before.

After about an hour, we drove the washed out, dirt road that led us to Pillars and Patrick and Medina's house. It was almost 1:00 a.m. and they had prepared a feast for their American guests. We dined on rice, chicken, beef, bananas, and sweet mangos and pineapple. In the light of Patrick and Medina's dining room (the only room in their house other than three small bedrooms for their family of seven), we were able to look into the eyes of our Ugandan friends, see their smiles, and hold their hands. The eyes of our A journey of discovery hearts began to open. unfolded and the words of Paul in Galatians 3:27-28 came to life... "As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus."

We've all experienced it before. The discomfort, uneasiness, and sometimes downright fear when we are in places or with people different from us. We are taught at a young age that different is dangerous, play it safe, and stick together with "birds of a feather." It is a natural reaction that requires the supernatural to overcome. What is this supernatural? Christ!

From then on, we grew closer and closer with our Ugandan friends, learning about their lives and ministry. The words of Tyler Merrit, author of "I Take My Coffee Black," came to mind: "proximity breeds empathy." We may have arrived in Uganda with sympathy in our hearts as we "felt sorry for" the struggles of Pillars and their children, but the more we saw, learned, and the closer we grew, sympathy was replaced by empathy as we now "felt the pain with." As the days went by, we were no longer aware that we were the only "muzungus" (white people) around. We began to understand their culture and embrace their way of living... all but their "hole in the ground" toilets. What happened was the supernatural, the work of God, differences dissolving and boundaries breaking down because of the One who made us one in faith, love, and service to one another - Jesus Christ.

By the end of our time in Uganda, we were family. While returning home brought such sweet bliss, our hearts ache for those with whom we became one. I wonder... if God can place us on the other side of the world to embrace people who are so different from us, work with them in a different culture, find common purpose and mission while holding different beliefs, and even use a hole in the ground for our toilet... maybe we can walk across the street and do the same thing here...

What is Holy Week?

Have you ever wondered what all took place on Holy Week? Did you realize that the gospels don't share the same timeline from Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday to his death and resurrection? What significance does this have for us today? Join our confirmation class on **Wednesday, April 5** for a night of intergenerational fun as we walk through the events of Holy Week with discussion, trivia, and games. Palm Sunday - April 2 "A Different Savior"

Start off Holy Week with us as we gather in the entryway for our palm procession. We will hear about Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem and how he is a different savior than was expected... both 2,000 years ago and today.

Good Friday - April 7 "A Different Death"

Join us on Friday at 7:00 p.m. for this traditional Tenebrae service. "Tenebrae" means "darkness or shadows" in Latin. As we read Matthew's account of Jesus' crucifixion, the shadows grow long and darkness claims the sanctuary and our hearts. We place nails in the cross to remember Jesus' death for us. The Christ Candle departs to signify Jesus sealed in the tomb, but returns to give us hope in despair and light in the darkness.

We will adorn our altar with live plants on Easter again this year. At its heart, Fresh Expressions is about two things: 1) Proclaiming that established churches have a critical, if not central, role to play in God's mission in our time. 2) Empowering and equipping God's people in every congregation to develop creative ways to reach the increasing diversity of our society.

Worship, Celebration, and Dinner... UGANDA STYLE!!!

On Sunday, April 30, join us for a worship service that breaks us free from our typical Lutheran norm as we incorporate music and prayer from our Ugandan neighbors at Pillars of Africa. Afterwards, we will host a meal similar to the cuisine our team enjoyed. As you eat, we will tell stories and show pictures of our adventures and share more about opportunities to walk more closely with the programs at Pillars as we help them become more sustainable. And look for the crafts! We brought three suitcases back filled with crafts from their Pillars Empowerment Program that supports local crafters and gives them training to improve their skills.

Jacksonville Food Center

Instead of the usual statistics quoting money spent for the biweekly food boxes filled according to family size, or the statistics for the weekly produce and meat table give-aways, I thought that the kind and thoughtful donations that were quoted at the monthly board meeting this month would be very appropriate.

The Boy Scouts had a food drive and gave a large donation. In January and February, food donations collected at First National Bank resulted in 310 pounds of food worth \$1,500. Jacksonville Middle School and Our Saviors School had a "Raising Food Contest", and Our Saviors also had a "Souper Bowl"

drive, so a lot of soup was received. Over 700 pounds of food were received.

The Food Center is anticipating bigger needs because there will be less government help due to elimination of pandemic and extra Food Stamps help. Also, this summer, children will be missing weekday school lunches. Suggestions for food donations that the children can fix for themselves are: taco shells, canned tuna, canned spaghetti, soup, canned fruit, and juices. Pop top cans are best, if possible.

In January, Faith Lutheran Church donated \$175 to the Food Center. In February, Faith donated \$265.
