Keeping Sabbath

⁸Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy. ⁹For six days you shall labor and do all your work. ¹⁰But the seventh day is a sabbath to the Lord your God; you shall not do any work—you, your son or your daughter, your male or female slave, your livestock, or the alien resident in your towns. ¹¹For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but rested the seventh day; therefore the Lord blessed the sabbath day and consecrated it.

- Exodus 20:8-11

Sabbath. What is sabbath? It's a Jewish thing, right? That's just one of those "Old Testament" practices for the Jewish people, but not for us. They lived in slavery, owned by a master, locked into a system that dictated their worth by what they could produce. When God freed them, they needed to learn how free people live, with God as their master instead of Pharaoh. But that's not us. We've got it all figured out. Or do we?

One day in seven, God says, stop all work. Stop and remember that you are not to be defined by your output. One day in seven, everyone rests, and all distinctions that we make to define our value and measure and worth disappear. When we practice sabbath keeping, we are all simply and completely human beings, alongside one another, all beloved children of God.

This is the hardest of the 10 Commandments to absorb, so God tells us to do it regularly. We have to regularly step out of the mindset and activity of the world around us, the measuring, comparing, competing, striving, producing, and consuming. We have to regularly stop *doing* and practice just *being*.

We have to regularly succumb to the cycles of rest and renewal that God built into the fabric of existence. One day in seven, we are to purposefully remember that you are not God. Purposefully remember that you are neither better nor worse than anyone around you. Purposefully remember that you are connected in a mutual belonging to God and each other. This is what it means to be human. This is what it means to be free.

For the month of June, I invite you all... no... challenge you all to keep the sabbath. Take one day in seven to stop being busy. To stop being distracted. To stop ignoring the ground beneath your feet, the breath in your lungs, the people around you, the emotions inside you, and the God who holds you. Rest is not a reward to be earned, it is a starting point.

It won't be easy! And rest assured, I'm not asking you to do something that I'm not willing to do myself. My family and I are committing to this challenge right along side of you. (Is it revealing that we are talking about rest as a sacrifice and time of suffering?!) I'm sure we will make mistakes, go through withdrawals, and crave a bit of the busyness to which we have grown too accustomed. At the same time, I suspect we will also discover something grand, like opening a gift and receiving something we never knew we wanted, but desperately needed all along.

Each week, look to our Facebook page for suggestions on how to keep the sabbath. Tell your stories of sabbath experiences and the moments that have surprised you and fed your soul. How you keep the sabbath is up to you, but remember, God commands it. And if we don't keep the sabbath, are we really free?
