#### Perfect ... Imperfect

It's a lesson we all need to learn. It may take longer for some than others. Some learn it gently... others with a crash. We all need to replace "I'm Perfect" with "Imperfect."

This is the title of a book I've been reading, "The

Imperfect Pastor: discovering joy in our limitations through a daily discipleship with Jesus" by Zach Eswine. Wait, did that say JOY in limitations? Yep! We all need to stop chasing after perfection (or pretending we are perfect) and embrace who we are, imperfections and all.

I haven't read the entire book yet (hey... I'm not perfect!), but here are some key points I've picked up along the way.

- 1. Be present. God has given you a place to inhabit, things to do there, and people to love. Attending to your work is attending to God's work among the faces and places. No matter how simple it may seem, it is significant!
- 2. Ways teach us. We learn more from what we observe in those around us than from what we are taught by a teacher, so we always bring our "home" with us. Be mindful of the ways you learned from others in your past and also the ways you are teaching others who observe you now.
- 3. Most of the time, you're invisible. God's work

through you is most often done in the simple and unnoticed conversations, interactions, and time alone. Life may often seem mundane, uncontrollable, and unfinished, but it is the field God has given us to cultivate, sow seed, and harvest for the Lord.

4. You can't be everywhere for everyone. Decide where you need to be and be there for those you love and who need you.

Now, this may be a book written to gently help pastors discover that they aren't perfect, but it has wisdom for us all. We begin a new sermon series this month on "The Good Life" by reading portions of the wisdom literature in the Bible (Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Solomon). What we need to remember... something that is so counter-cultural today is that we can't be perfect and we shouldn't pretend to be perfect. The good life is lived

fully aware of our imperfections and fully leaning on God.

I pray that our time reflecting on keeping sabbath was a good start to the summer. Now, give yourself grace. Learn from Jesus. Be present. Be mindful of the ways you teach and learn. Make the most of your invisible time. And be fully present with those in front of you. We are imperfect, and our limitations can actually be a source of joy as we follow Jesus together.

## Synod Assembly elects New Bishop

The Rev. Greg Busboom was elected bishop of the Central/Southern Illinois Synod of the ELCA on Saturday, June 3 at the synod's annual assembly. Pastor Busboom has served as lead pastor at St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church in Springfield, Illinois, since 2011. He previously served as Pastor of Outreach and Discipleship at St. John's from 2007 to 2011 and pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church in Carthage, Illinois, from 1999 to 2007. Pastor Busboom holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in English and history from the U of I at Urbana-Champaign; Master of Divinity degree from Trinity Lutheran Seminary in Columbus, Ohio; and Doctor of Ministry degree in congregational mission and leadership from Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota. Pastor Busboom will take office as bishop on September 1 and will be installed at a worship service on September 23 in Springfield. He succeeds the Rev. S. John Roth, who will retire on August 31 after 12 years of service as bishop.

# Living Our Mission ... Showing Christ's Love

Our mission calls us to "show Christ's love" as we share the love of Jesus with one another at Faith and our neighbors near and far. Here are some ways you can join us!

#### Jacksonville Food Center

Now that schools are out for the summer, families in need are more in need, as lunch every day for children is needed at home instead of away. {That's a lot of needs!}

Even before school was out, the number of families needing food increased dramatically in May. 374 families (1,007 people) were served for food boxes in May, costing \$50,285. In comparison, April stats were 229 families (467 people). These statistics do not include the weekly bakery/produce customers.

Please remember all those who need help. Let us love our neighbor as ourselves. If you prefer bringing food donations to Faith, lunch items for kids such as canned (pop top) soups, spaghettis, crackers, peanut butter, jelly, or anything a child will find easy to prepare at home. Money donations are perfect for the Food Center to purchase exactly what is needed.

The churches donated \$2,115.00 in money and \$1,104.50 in food donations. In May, Faith church donated \$250 in money. An additional \$1,000 was given to the Food Center as a result of sharing our love after our congregational meeting.
