1. All of us are priests. Every believer is called to serve or minister, not just a select few.

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Ministries that Send: Workplace Ministries: Relating to people in the workplace in ways that reflect our identity as Christians and our personal and social concern.	
Ministries that Send: Community Ministries: Being involved in activities that exemplify Christian concern and care for social and personal needs in the surrounding community.	
Ministries that Send: Witness Ministries: Taking advantage of opportunities and techniques for evangelism and faith sharing in varied settings, at home and around the world.	

The gifts are divine abilities to bring about
justice, wholeness, and righteousness,
simplified and exemplified in the life and
works of Jesus Christ. The ultimate goal of
revealing God's glory in all things and persons
is the central theme of the four major
passages that talk about spiritual gifts:
Romans 12:6-8, 27-30; 1 Corinthians 12:8-11;
Ephesians 4:6-8; 1 Peter 4:10-11.
