


#### IT'S IN YOUR HANDS By Pastor Adam

Find someone to do it with you and fill out a ministry team proposal (there's a QR code for that too)! Are you a bit uncertain about how to get involved? That's okay. ## Time Capsule


Let's leave some memories for the next generation. Bring a picture of your family and/or an event at church that you would like included. The capsule will be sealed and reopened in 25 years in 2048!

## Fall Sermon Series - "A Family Tree of Faith"

This Fall, the narrative lectionary takes us on a journey through the Old Testament that looks at significant characters of faith. Each one shows us the ups and downs of our family tree of faith. Watch as a tree takes shape in our sanctuary, learn more about these iconic people, and discover the faith that is passed on through the generations... to us and beyond.

- October 1 "Roots" In Genesis we hear of God's creative power as God creates our world and all that is in it. Our roots go all the way back to what it means to be created and given life by God.
- October 8 "A Trunk of Faithfulness: Abraham, Sarah, and Isaac" God promises a son for Abraham and Sarah, but they are old, beyond childbearing years, and Sarah laughs with little faith. But God is faithful and follows through on God's promise. How do we live in faith when it's hard to trust, and how do we know God will be faithful?
- October 15 "A Twisted Trunk: Jacob and Esau" The story of Jacob and Esau is one of competition from the womb. Their rivalry brings Jacob to a wrestling match with God, but also to him becoming Israel, the father of 12 tribes who passes a heritage of faith on to us. How do we wrestle with God, and how do we pass on faith to the next generation?
- October 22 "Branches of Freedom: Moses" In time, the Jewish people become slaves in Egypt and cry out to God. God hears their cry and calls Moses to lead them to freedom. Moses believes himself to be incapable of such a call, but leans on the gifts of others and allows God to work through him. When do we doubt our gifts and how can we lean on God and others to answer God's call?
- October 29 "Prone to Split: Elijah" (Reformation Sunday!) King David stumbled and fell into temptation, showing just how deeply sin is engrained in us. In turn, the Israelites reveal this sin as they turn to other gods. Elijah, one of God's prophets, has been sent to bring them back to a trust in God. How do we sin and turn to other Gods, and who are the prophets of today that bring us back?

# **Reformation Sunday**

If you have any Lutheran background, this time of year brings a hankering to belt out "a mighty fortress is our God!" On October 29, you've got the opportunity. Celebrate Reformation Sunday with us and wear red, the color of the Holy Spirit, as we trust that God's reforming work and refining fire continue to be at work in us and throughout Christ's church.

## All Saints Sunday

On November 5, we will be celebrating All Saints Sunday. It is an



opportunity to remember all the saints of God, specifically recalling members and loved ones of members of our congregation who have died or were baptized in the last year. If you would like the name of your loved one shared, please submit it to the church office by Friday, November 3.

**Chancel Choir** rehearsal will be on Thursday October 19 at 5:30pm for 45 minutes in the sanctuary.



**Posters** are available for you to take around town to help us advertise.


Envelopes are available if you'd like to provide a **Monetary Donation** for purchasing supplies. Put your envelope in the box provided, and please put your name on the sign-up list.

#### Jacksonville Food Center

The Jacksonville Food Center made its move across the street (311 E. Morgan Street) for more space and better service. They now have lots of parking and easy access off of East Morgan Street. The move was featured on the front page of the Journal Courier several weeks ago.

The number of bi-monthly food boxes served to those in need has once again increased from 397 in July to 458 families in August (1,136 people) at a cost of \$60,245. 229 families were served for bakery/ produce at a cost of \$3,080. The churches donated \$3,829.54 in money and \$1,298 in food donations. Faith Church donated \$250 in August. There are many families in our area who need our help.
