


The first candle is lit.

The Advent Wreath

The concept of the Advent wreath began in Germany in the mid-16th century. The wreath as a whole is meant to remind us of both the immortality of our souls and God's promise of everlasting life to us through Christ. The candles also have their own special significance. The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent. and one candle is lit each Sunday. Three of the candles are purple because that liturgical color signifies a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice. The first and second candles. which are purple, represent hope and peace, respectively. The third candle, which is pink, signifies joy, and the fourth candle, which is purple, represents love. The white candle is placed in the middle of the wreath and is lit on Christmas Eve. It is known as the "Christ Candle" and represents the life of Christ.
