

"Advent Preparations"

Our annual post-Thanksgiving decorating blitz was a success! Typically, the Sunday after Thanksgiving, we spend the afternoon setting up the Christmas tree, hanging garland and lights, and putting up other various decorations. While the bulk of it is complete, there will be more preparations from making cookies, watching favorite Christmas movies, and rebuilding holiday Lego sets (we have an entire village under the tree!). We also pull out our Christmas books to read again every year. Last night, Desmond and I read "Who is Coming to Our House?" It is a favorite that dates back all the way to baby Marilyn and tells the story of barn animals preparing for special visitors. The pig makes room while the lamb cleans the ground. The goose stacks the hay and a duck lines a manger with down. All the animals chip in to prepare for the guests who turn out to be Mary, Joseph, and the newborn baby Jesus. We spend so much time preparing, from decorating our homes to preparing for the arrival of guests, but advent is about more than that.

The word advent comes from the Latin "adventus" which means coming or arrival. It's a translation of the Greek "parousia" which means "second coming" and refers to Jesus' return. Advent, therefore, is both a time of anticipatory celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ and preparation for Christ's return. This is evident in the purple candles we often see in church advent wreaths. Purple is the traditional color of repentance, a central theme of advent. However, many churches (ours included) have shifted to the use

of blue candles. Blue is the color of hope, another central theme. We find hope in God's promise fulfilled in the birth of Jesus the messiah, we find hope in the Spirit as Jesus comes into our hearts and lives anew each day, and we find hope in the promise that Christ will come again to redeem all that is broken in the world. How does one prepare for that?!

Here are some suggestions:

- * Decorate your home... with new intention. Mark the changing of seasons by changing your home, but also seek change in your heart. Whether you hang lights or light candles, every time you flip a switch or strike a match, invite the Light of the World to enter into your darkness. Advent wreaths will be available at church for you to borrow.
- * Bake cookies... for others. No, this isn't a shameless ploy for cookies! Find a way to give to others and share the joy of this season. Sharing with your family, friends, and pastor are great, but who else may need a reminder of God's love and abundance?
- * Spend time together... with God. We often make time to visit family and friends around the holidays, but this is also a great time to share stories of faith, spend time in devotions, or go to church together. Our family will be reading "Jotham's Journey" every night during advent... you are welcome to pick up a copy at church and read along!

These are just a few ways to prepare for the arrival of Jesus this Advent. In whatever way you prepare, may God's gifts of hope, peace, love, and joy be yours.

A Note of Great Thanksgiving

We closed the doors of the **Giving Boutique** last Sunday thoroughly grateful and gob-smacked (or, perhaps, more accurately, "God-smacked") by the results.

Together, we raised the following amounts for the six organizations we selected: Faith Lutheran Youth Group, \$1,272; HUGS, \$2,323; "Share the Light" ministry, \$1,214.50; Foster Care Closet, \$412,50; Lutheran World Relief, \$415; and Jacksonville Food Center, \$385.

The Giving Boutique raised a grand total of \$6,022.

Count Up to Advent in Our REVERSE ADVENT PROJECT

It is that joyful time again for our Reverse Advent project. Reverse Advent adds up rather than counting down to Christmas, by adding a different food item each day of Advent. Take home a festive bag located next to the Working Cross in the Gathering Area and collect food. You will find the suggested list of food items and suggestions in each bag.

Consider reaching out to friends to participate with us. Take them a bag and let them experience the joy of sharing the spirit of the holiday. Then volunteer to bring their bag back to church. Better yet, invite them to an Advent Allegro concert or a worship service, and they can place their bag with the others.

If you find your bag too small for all your items, just take another one. Tie the handles together when you return your bags to the church.

We hope to fill the area under the Working Cross with bags for our neighbors. Please bring your bags to the church by Christmas Eve or Christmas Day. If you would like to help deliver them, contact Hallie Mayner.

Jacksonville Food Center

The number of families needing help with food has increased from 446 families (1,046 people) in September to 630 (1,562 people) in October. This help involves bimonthly food boxes containing enough food for two weeks. Daily bakery and produce choices are available once a week (423 people in October). Costs in October for these two services are \$81,805.00, and \$3,530.00 respectively.

On Friday, November 17, 100 turkeys and 100 hams were delivered by State Senator Jill Tracy's office to be given away on November 20. Also involved were State Senator Frese and State Representative Davidsmeyer.

Sign up for the yearly Christmas boxes offered by the Food Center is occurring in November.

In October, the churches contributed \$2,810.27 in money and \$447.50 in food donations. Our Faith Lutheran church donated \$295. The Food Center especially needs egg cartons. Egg donations from large food stores come in large boxes.
