<ul> <li>Explain how you relate to this statement: "Jesus was not as strong as He was ready." How does this statement speak to your ability to overcome temptation? Not about power bu weapons</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>How do the things that satisfy you compete with your obedience to God? How do good thing compete with your relationship with God.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>What is the thought process that was discussed in the sermon 1. Thought 2 3</li> <li>4? According to the sermon, how many seconds do you have to disarm a thought before it takes hold in your mind?</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>In the sermon you were asked to name your temptation: "You're only as strong as you are</li> </ul>
