Life is lived in the unresolved

Warmup: As a kid or teenager, were you a skeptic or an idealist?

READ Hebrews 11:8-13, 23-29, 39-40

- What is the Biblical definition of faith? Paraphrase this definition into a pithy statement that speaks to your heart (10 words or less).
- Hebrews 11 is sometimes referred to as the “Faith Hall of Fame,” in this passage which person’s story has the greatest impact upon your faith?
- What is God saying to you in this passage?

REFLECT

- Zoom in on the personalities your Life Group identified as impactful, what questions would these faith heroes have asked as they lived life in the space of “unresolved” answers?
- Does it require more effort to trust your best friend, or God? Identify a current area where your faith is being stretched? Pair up with one person in your Life Group and explain how God could use this challenge to transform you. Read verse 6 together and pray as the Holy Spirit leads.
- How does what Jesus is teaching you in these verses line up with your life?

RESPOND

- Read Psalm 17:6-8. Pastor Jack mentioned that in the “waiting,” you have to get good at something you hate – waiting. In groups of three, explain how you will use the Psalms and Hebrews 11 passage, to encourage you in the wait – be creative.
- Life is lived in the unresolved. Who do you want to be when the waiting is over? Name one action step to move you closer to becoming the person you described in the previous question. Text your action step to a friend and add it to your weekly calendar.
- How is the Spirit leading you to respond this week?
