

# JOHN CHAPTER 10 (FACILITATOR)

### **Discussion Starter**

- Are you a person who likes to have many options or just a few options? Why?
- Opening Prayer
  - Ask if someone wants to volunteer before leading the prayer.

# **Tell the Story**

• PLEASE MAKE SURE THAT YOU HAVE ONE PERSON WHO STORIES (SUMMARIZES THE CHAPTER) BEFORE THE GROUP READS THE CHAPTER TOGETHER.

### Read the Story (John 10:1-42)

Read out loud as a group, 3-5 verses per person. Let everyone know they can opt out if they would like.

# **Breaking it Down**

• All questions should be utilized as appropriate based upon group dynamics to facilitate both understanding and discussion. Don't feel tied to the questions and don't feel like you must get through every question. Follow the Spirit's lead! All questions are a matter of perspective in some way BUT there are specific questions that this is truer of, and these questions have been indicated to be perspective/opinion questions.

# John 10:1-18

- □ What do you think the differences are between viewing Jesus as one of many options in how you choose to live versus viewing Jesus as the only option in how you choose to live?
  - This is a perspective and opinion question so please listen as the facilitator.
- □ Do you believe that God's heart is for you and if so, how do you daily practice listening for His voice?

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- Reread John 10:17-18 and read Hebrews 12:1-4. After reading these passages, consider the following questions. Did Jesus have to go to the cross? Did Jesus want to go to the cross? Why is it important for us to consider these questions as His disciples?
  - God's plan certainly revolved around Jesus going to the cross and in order for Jesus to fully surrender to His Father, He had to go to the cross, but it is important to realize that going to the cross was a choice for Jesus. Giving up His life was a choice for Him. He says by His own words that no one took His life from Him. While the results of the cross were beautiful to Jesus, He didn't want to go to the cross. All these things are important to remember and live because following Jesus for us is a decision and Jesus has left us an example of how we are to sacrificially love like He did.

### John 10:19-42

- □ Notice what Jesus says in verse 25 in response to the people asking Him to tell them plainly whether He was the Christ. Consider the following things that Jesus said prior to this.
  - I told you, I am the one who came from heaven (John 3:13, 6:38).
  - I told you, whoever believes on Me has eternal life (John 3:15).
  - I told you, I am the unique Son of God (John 5:19-23).
  - I told you, I will judge all humanity (John 5:19-23)
  - I told you, all should honor Me just as the honor God the Father (John 5:19-23).
  - I told you, I am the Bread of Life (John 6:48).
  - **I told you**, I am the Light of the World (John 8:12).
- □ What do you think the disconnect was for the people when Jesus was so clear? How does this apply to you and me today?
  - These are perspective and opinion questions so please listen as the facilitator.

# **Final Application**

- What does this passage teach us about God?
- What does this passage teach us about mankind?
- What is a command to obey in this passage?
- What has God revealed in your life that needs changing?
- What truth can be applied to your life about the gospel?

# **Closing & Prayer Requests**

- Have a designated person to capture and share (as appropriate) within the life group.
