January 2024 Session Meetings Highlights

The Session welcomed new members Karla Canfield, Gary Wall, Harry White and Al Youmans, elected by the Congregation on January 7 and installed on January 14.

Pastor David reported that the Advent sermon series "The Sacred Songs of Christmas" received much positive feedback from the congregation. Christmas Eve services were well attended. Pastor David reported the courtyard shade structure roof was installed and the concrete work should be completed shortly. Pastor David will be attending a men's retreat in Houston February 4-11. Pastor David was invited to write a devotional for the Presbyterian Outlook Lenten Devotional publication.

The Magnify Commission (matters relating to worship) is preparing for Ash Wednesday services on February 14 and providing devotionals for the Lenten season. The Lenten Luncheon Series (started last year) will be repeated this Lenten season.

The Serve Commission (serving others outside of MVPC) will be assembling homeless care packs on Sunday, February 4 between services. The Veterans' Support Group scheduled a chili cookoff on March 22 and a Memorial Day weekend breakfast on May 18. The Pet Ministry's annual bake sale is on February 11. The Quilters Group donated \$1,784 to MVPC for mission outreach. The Commission recommended \$1,000 be donated to Caridad (supporting homeless persons), which Session approved. The Hoving Home choir will perform at MVPC Sunday services on March 17.

The Nurture Commission (taking care of our congregation) reported 16 children attend Christmas Vacation Bible School, with a great group of adult and teenage volunteers assisting. Men's and Women's Bible Studies are seeing good attendance. Stephen Ministry has new candidates participating in training classes. Grief Share resumed meeting on January 23 with 13 participants.

The Gather Commission (taking care of gathering in groups large and small) reported that the new kitchen equipment is up and running. Only remaining renovation is a new countertop, which should be installed shortly.

Stewardship Commission (being good managers of time, talents, and treasures). Reminder that per capita of \$46 per member is due. MVPC's 20+ year old fire alarm system has been malfunctioning. Elder Renny Fransz presented three proposals for upgrading the system. Session had some questions regarding the proposals which Elder Fransz and Elder Al Youmans will investigate.

Session approved hiring MVPC member Alison Gray as the Women's Ministry Director, as proposed at the December 2023 Session meeting. The Annual Congregational meeting is scheduled for Sunday, February 25 following the second service. Session elected Dennis Bunce, Chris Kirschman and Dian Ward as MVPC's Commissioners for the 2024 Nevada Presbytery meetings.

The next Session meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, February 28, 2024 at 7:00 p.m.


Let's help these students have a great Prom and make amazing memories!

Black History Month - Miss Betsey Stockton



Miss Betsey Stockton was the first unmarried female missionary in the modern mission era, founding a school for the Maka'ainana, the ordinary people on the Sandwich Islands (now Hawaii), in 1824.

Betsey Stockton was born to an enslaved mother in Princeton, New Jersey around 1798. She took her last name from Robert Stockton, the first man who owned her family. At a young age, Betsey was given to Robert's daughter, Elizabeth Green, who was the wife of a Presbyterian minister.

Under the Green family's tutelage, Betsey was not only raised in the faith but also offered a rigorous classical education alongside the Green children. Betsey later became a communing member of Princeton's First Presbyterian Church.

Betsey poured her energy into a zeal to help the less fortunate. She would start a Sabbath school for the Black children of Princeton before answering the Lord's call to become a missionary to the Sandwich Islands. She set sail with Charles and Harriet Stewart in 1822.

She was the first single American woman to be commissioned as an overseas missionary. While in the village of Lahaina, on Maui, she began the first school for "commoners." Upon her return to the United States in 1826, she would continue to be involved in education for the rest of her life. In 1840, she helped found the first Black presbyterian church in Princeton, Witherspoon Street Presbyterian Church, and would be an active parishioner until her death in 1865.

Today, the Betsey Stockton Foundation continues her work by supporting ethnic minorities who want to make disciples among the nations and see churches reproduced. The Foundation provides grants to ethnic minority individuals sent from the United States with a focus on reaching unchurched peoples.
