first morning in Georgetown, Guyana, walked to a nearby radio station, and they told me that the material that we had, demanded that we go to the largest radio station in the country, TV/Radio NCN. They also warned us, in no uncertain terms, "never walk alone, anywhere, you must call for a driver, it is just too dangerous!" They arranged for the first of many rides!

After wandering through this massive maze of radio and TV offices at NCN we found Mr. Travis, the administrator, and his blind assistant....and. so they listened. Finally, Mr. Travis threw his hands up and said, "I'm totally convinced!!!" It took three full weeks of meetings and interviews before getting the contracts signed and programs into their hands. The Guyanese National Broadcast Authority (GNBA) has made some editing requirements. Yikes...just not enough of me to do this alone. We flew in to the U.S. and immediately drove to Florida! Thanks be to God that our

daughter, Jenny, and her husband, Josh, canceled work and gave us 2 full days of editing. continue to work on this project while I keep writing and recording new material. Mil gracias, hijitos!

NCN has an unmatched broadcasting reach, covering 80% of Guyana's Radio and Television viewer and listener ship and broadcasts 24 hours daily with programs tailored for every demographic within Guyana. NCN operates three coastal Radio Stations also."

Wonderful Words of Life—is the name that NCN has given to our program. Locked in and paid for ... one program a week for the next 6 months as we wait to see if the Lord will provide for more! First broadcast was to be on Friday, December 1 at our allotted time of 10:15 in the morning! It started off with quite the drama as we were informed of Venezuela's territorial dispute over Guyana's Essequibo region that had

escalated into a crisis that very week. Many of you heard us a praisin' on that day! Our first response came that very afternoon. Ms. Indira, wife of Guyanese Transit Commissioner, took the time to write and encourage us ... like in truly a 'fresh oil'

We did not have the liberty to walk the streets and markets as we had planned! When we did attempt to do so, a 'guard' would be sent to walk with us having cylinders of 'mace' in each hand! Are you gettin' the picture here! Despite these obstacles, we did get opportunities to share the Gospel and to alert the Guyanese of the Radio programs. Even some of our drivers and guards helped us with these endeavors. We made lots of sweet friends that we hear from every week! We were invited into their homes and even taken to dinner a couple of times. More of a sacrifice than imaginable. The limited options of hotels and restaurants were very expensive. We should have gotten the hint just from the struggles to get affordable flights into the country. Actually, we've never met anyone with Guyana on their bucket list!!
