


this Seeds of Easter music and videos will help prepare your family's heart to focus on Jesus death and resurrection.

The imaginative visuals and humorous sound effects give kids the opportunity to retell the story in their own words and bring the Bible to life like never before.

March 2024 Session Meetings Highlights

The Deacon Bereavement Team assisted with the memorial service for Ronnilou Kordick on March 22 and Paul Shore on March 23. The annual Meet Your Deacon Sunday will be April 14.

Pastor David reported that MVPC received a donation of \$89,000.00 from a member desiring to remain anonymous. Holy Week services will include Maundy Thursday on March 28 at 7:00 p.m., Good Friday on March 29 at noon and 7:00 p.m., and Easter on March 31 at 8:00, 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. Job descriptions for staff will be reviewed as part of the budget process for the 2024-2025 fiscal year. Session discussed the importance of maintaining MVPC's facilities as they age and maintaining appropriate reserves to meet those needs.

The Magnify Commission (matters relating to worship) reported that the Sanctuary will be decorated for Holy Week. The Commission is also looking at replacing older banners used in the Sanctuary. A new church photographer will be needed as Cathy Linss is moving to Texas in June.

The Serve Commission (serving others outside of MVPC) reported that the Mission Committee assisted with the luncheon for the Hoving Home choir on March 17. The Honduras mission trip is scheduled for May 25-June 1 with six people going.

The Nurture Commission (taking care of our congregation) reported that Vacation Bible School is scheduled for June and the curriculum has been ordered. The Youth Group mission focus this year will be local day trips serving various ministries in the Las Vegas area. A number of youth will be attending the Presbyterian summer camp at Calvin Crest near Yosemite National Park.

The Gather Commission (taking care of gathering in groups large and small) reported that the Dinner for Six and Dinner for Eight groups are set. Elder Renny Fransz is preparing a training class for people working in and using the kitchen.

Stewardship Commission (being good managers of time, talents, and treasures). Elder George Gray discussed various budget items for the 2024-2025 fiscal year, hoping to have a budget for approval at the May Session meeting. An inspection of MVPC facilities by the Fire Marshall found 24 violations, including the necessity to replace all exit signs in the building. Session approved the \$1,900.00 bid for the work. Several items will require contractor bids to repair and a number of items can be repaired by facilities manager Mark Washburn.

Pastor David and Elders Chris Kirschman, Dian Ward and Dennis Bunce reported on the Spring Presbytery meeting held at Green Valley Presbyterian Church on March 11-13. The Presbytery approved commissioned ruling elder training for Gary Wall. Upon Gary's completion of training, MVPC will have three commissioned ruling elders: Chris Kirschman, Dennis Bunce and Gary Wall.

The next Session meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, April 24, 2024 at 7:00 p.m.
