### Peter - God does the "Extraordinary" through the "Ordinary!"

This Sunday we begin a short sermon series on "God does the Extraordinary through the Ordinary." Our first Biblical character in this series is the Apostle Peter.

In the tapestry of the New Testament, few threads are as vibrant and richly woven as that of the apostle Peter. His journey from a humble fisherman to a towering figure in the early Christian church is a testament to the transformative power of faith and the boundless grace of God.

Peter's significance lies not only in his remarkable deeds and bold proclamations but also in his humanity, flaws, and moments of profound growth. From the shores of Galilee to the streets of Jerusalem, Peter's life is marked by pivotal moments that continue to inspire and challenge believers today.

One of the defining moments in Peter's life is his confession of faith in Jesus as "the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:16). Peter's significance extends beyond his individual experiences to his role in the early Christian church. From preaching on the day of Pentecost to boldly proclaiming the gospel to the Gentiles, Peter played a pivotal role in spreading the message of Jesus Christ to the ends of the earth.

As we reflect on the significance of the apostle Peter, may we be inspired by his unwavering faith, challenged by his moments of weakness, and encouraged by his journey of growth and transformation. Like Peter, may we embrace our humanity, rely on God's grace, and boldly proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ to the world.


#### THE PRAYER PRACTICE

#### THE ARMOR OF GOD




In this in-depth look at God's Word and the spiritual armor He provides, Dr. Tony Evans goes through each piece of the armor of God.


