On August 8, 1974, I was an 11-year-old summer camp attendee. Instead of the usual evening program of singing and speaker, arrangements had been made to broadcast an address from then US President Nixon. Over the speakers in the amphitheater, we heard the words, "I shall resign the Presidency at noon tomorrow."

The Watergate cover-up had finally been exposed. The house of cards that was the Nixon Presidency, including those closest to him, were coming crashing down. Among those implicated was former Special Counsel to the President Charles (Chuck) Colson. Known around the Washington beltway as Nixon's "hatchet man," Colson's reputation was that of cutthroat and ruthless.


But Colson's world was crashing around him. A failed marriage. The looming criminal conviction and prison sentence (which happened), the loss of reputation, influence and career all brought this tough as nails politician to his knees. Literally.

Colson began to ask questions of those in Washington he respected and whose lives seemed to stand in stark contrast to his own. Christians, including Senator Harold Hughes, were skeptical of the reports that the hatchet man was exploring the claims of Christianity. When asked to meet with Colson and study the Bible with him, Hughes at first refused and later reluctantly agreed to only meet him late at night in a remote location, out of the public eye for fear of being associated with such an awful excuse for a man.

But Charles Colson was being pursued by the Holy Spirit of God and being taught and loved by some faithful followers of Jesus. At one of those Bible study sessions, Colson bowed his head and gave his life to Jesus. He never looked back, growing quickly into a leading Christian statesman and founder of Prison Fellowship, advocating for Christ-honoring and dignified treatment of prisoners, along with Christian programs aimed at true rehabilitation of the heart.

When Colson gave his life to Christ, Senator Hughes walked toward him with arms wide open and proclaimed, "Chuck, we are brothers for life!" We're going to look at another life transformation this Sunday. He became known as the Apostle Paul. You won't want to miss his story!



April 2024 Session Meetings Highlights

The Deacon Bereavement Team assisted with the two memorial services in April. The annual Meet Your Deacon Sunday was held on April 14 and very well attended, with 208 people signing the Deacon registries. The Deacons reported enjoying the event and spending time talking with members.

Pastor David performed two weddings in April (quite unusual at MVPC, Curt Hill and Liz Simonelli on April 20 and Del Billmire and Jerry Heiss on April 24. On April 7, Pastor David baptized Iris Nicole Fox, the infant daughter of Jayde and Max Fox (who became members of MVPC on April 28, together with 7 other new members). Pastor David presented the invocation at the Las Vegas City Council meeting on April 17. Pastor David reported that Tami Samek will be taking over MVPC's social media program.

The Magnify Commission (matters relating to worship) reported that the National Day of Prayer is May 2. The Sanctuary will be available all day. Pentecost Sunday is May 19. The Commission needs a new captain to organize the usher team. Please contact Dian Ward.

The Serve Commission (serving others outside of MVPC) reported that 240 homeless bags were assembled on April 21 and the Pet Ministry also prepared homeless bags for dogs. The first Sunday food collection gathered approximately \$750 worth of food items for the Salvation Army. On April 28, MVPC presented the Caridad homeless ministry with checks from the Nevada Presbytery in the amount of \$1,500 and from MVPC in the amount of \$250.

The Nurture Commission (taking care of our congregation) reported that the Youth Group enjoyed a bowling outing on April 28. Sunday School will continue throughout the summer. The Women's Ministry enjoyed Elder Renny Fransz as a speaker at its break event on April 20. The Men's Ministry Bible study is studying the minor prophets of the Old Testament. A new support group for widows, called "Just Us," is forming. This summer will see a repeat of last summer's Super Supper Summer Study to be held on June 18, July 23 and August 27 at 6:00 p.m. (dinner included).

The Gather Commission (taking care of gathering in groups large and small) reported that Baseball Sunday on April 21 was great fun, with hot dogs and Cracker Jacks served during fellowship hour. The Coffee Shop is still looking for more volunteers to help. Veterans Outreach is sponsoring a pancake breakfast on Saturday, May 18 beginning at 9:00 a.m.

Stewardship Commission (being good managers of time, talents, and treasures). Elder Al Youmans reported that MVPC will incur additional facilities expenses for upgrades needed to meet current fire codes. Installation of the new fire detection system is almost complete. Elder George Gray reported that the 2024-2025 fiscal year budget is almost completed. Elder Dave Geeting reported on updates to the employee policy manual and recognition of Dr. Mark Wherry for his 20 years of service to MVPC's music program.







Men's and Women's Bible study will have their final meetings of the Spring on May 21st at 6 p.m.
