
Dance of Life

Kari Lindholm-Johnson has been a presenter for several PATHWAYS events in the past. She recently lost her battle to cancer. We want to honor her memory and legacy within the spiritual life community by highlighting her words in this quarter's newsletter.

How does God's grace actively work in our lives and participate in our circumstances?

I use a compass to assist in my ideas of release and growth. It begins by releasing to a center point, and moving around that center point. This central point reminds us of our beginnings. With a compass you have to rest in the center but there also is movement — movement on the outer part of the circle, which reminds me of Hildegard of Bingen and her principal of "Viriditas," the greening fire that rises and moves throughout all living beings, that greening force that sprouts life. The rising in the act of making a circle and so receiving grace and resting from above and then that rising from below.

Each new painted circle then involves centering on the outside boundary of the previously made circle, again releasing oneself to the center. So then this concept of centering and release and then moving to the outside of our boundaries and centering again.



And in this there is the willingness to encounter another, that something new is created and a mandorla space happens. A mandorla space is that liminal space where spaces overlap. We find meaning as we rest in the center, encounter others, yet still remain grounded. This occurs as we engage in other opinions and reevaluate our own suppositions, our own edifices that we build.

This reminds me of a hymn, Now the green blade rises from the buried grain, Wheat that in the dark earth many years has lain; Love lives again, that with the dead has been: Love is come again, like wheat that springs up green. I feel like this is a good metaphor... releasing oneself to the center and being open to receive the dance of life in creation, and what so many offer in love and generosity, and releasing to the One who gives us life. I feel like I am encountering the edge of new boundaries. It feels essential to release myself to protest and to listen in new ways.

May you feel the breath of life breathing in you, God's grace surrounding you, and uplifting you.


