SILVER DIME CEREMONY & GUEST FORUM Sunday September 29, 10:30 am

William Popham's original land lease required the vestry and wardens of St. James the Less to pay a silver dime to a Popham descendant whenever requested. Join us Sunday morning at 10:30am for a service of traditional hymns, liturgy, and the historic payment of a silver dime to members of the Popham family. Followed at 11:30 by a forum by Jim Boulden, Popham descendent, sharing his recent research on the Popham and Morris family history with the slave trade in Barbados, with special attention given to the enslaved men, women and children who worked on their estates. Come learn from this important lecture on the complexity of our history, which is also part of our identity as Episcopalians, parishioners of St. James the Less, and members of the worldwide Anglican Communion.

Anniversary Concerts

Lectures

OUR ORIGIN STORY, 1840s-1850s Sunday October 6, 11:30 am

Drawing from our archives and historical documents, parishioner Hadley Miller guides us through the early years of St. James the Less. Building on Jim Boulden's inaugural lecture the week before, she'll cover the Morris and Popham families, the early years of St. James, and what came before.

EARLY GROWTH AND CHALLENGES, 1860s-1880s Sunday November 3, 11:30 am

The Civil War and Palm Sunday fire presented some of our earliest challenges as a parish. Parishioner Russell Crane tells us about how the leadership of St. James responded to the issues in the day, making St. James a stronger, more resilient parish.

Special Guests Lecture: VETERANS OF ST. JAMES THE LESS Sunday November 10, 11:30 am

Veteran, researcher, and historian Bill Stump returns to St. James the Less to share with us loads of information about the veterans in our graveyard. This talk will take place in various parts of the graveyard, so dress warmly.

ST. JAMES THE LESS IN A NEW CENTURY, 1890s-1910s Sunday December 8, 11:30 am

The new century--our second as a parish--brought significant change to our sleepy, rural parish. Parishioner Toni Lewis walks us through the founding of the Parish Messenger, the first big pandemic of 1918, WWI, and electricity!

THE LARGEST CHURCH IN WESTCHESTER, 1920s-1940s Sunday March 9, 11:30 am

The 1920s-40s brought tremendous change to St. James the Less. Rapidly increasing membership with the addition of the commuter rail necessitated more space for our growing congregation. The additions of the Great Hall, church transepts and chancel under the leadership of Dudley Stroup and Harry Price made St. James more recognizably the church it is today. Scarsdale was "ground zero" for Episcopalianism, making us, for a time, the largest church in Westchester county. Parishioner Russell Grant guides us through this eventful period of our history.

Special Guests: TAKING A STANCE - THE HOLLY BALL AFFAIR, 1950s-1970s Sunday April 6, 11:30 am

Parishioner, lifelong area resident, and history teacher John McNally talks to us about one of the most famous events for St. James on a national stage: the rector's refusal of Communion to the parishioners who denied access of a young Christian man of Jewish parentage to the Scarsdale Golf Club's annual debutante ball, the Holly Ball. John will be joined by Geff Kempsell, the son of that rector, the Rev. George Kempsell, who remembers the event and its aftermath well, and also local rabbis.

ST. JAMES: 1980s-PRESENT -- AND BEYOND Sunday May 4, 11:30 am

Like the wider Church, St. James has undergone much change in the last several decades. From its more outward stance in the community to its membership contraction, growth, and diversification, parishioner Geoff Loftus talks to us about St. James in recent decades and our hopes for its future.
