# GATHERING

### \*Call to Worship and Confession

- P: As we consider what it means to be a disciple, we ask ourselves the question:
- C: Who am I following?
- P: Everybody is following something or someone, but are we following Jesus? As we gather for worship, we are here to praise God for who God is and all that God has done.
