



Voting Faithfully — Community Time Discussion on September 22

Pastor Casey will lead a conversation about the Ballot Measure Voter Guide prepared by the Lutheran Office of Public Policy - California, on whose Policy Council she serves as the Pacifica Synod clergy representative. You can access the voter guide in advance at lutheranpublicpolicyca.org, and there will be paper copies available during Community Time on the 22nd. The recommendations are based on the Social Statements and Social Messages of the ELCA, which can be accessed on the ELCA website in their entirety. Our discussion will be non-partisan and only about the ballot measures; we will not discuss individuals running for elected office in November. Email pastor@sanmarcoslutheran.org with any questions.
