



Fighter Verses

Family Worship Outline

Below is an example of how to use the Fighter Verse over five days of family worship. Each day is structured to be less than 10 minutes. In Family Worship, Don Whitney encourages families to read, pray, and sing together.

Read.

Day 1

Read the verse in context, including some verses before and/or after the Fighter Verse. Then, solely read the verse. Identify the main idea of the verse.

Day 2

Define and explain keywords in the Fighter Verse. Play a game of charades using the keywords learned.

Day 3

Read the verse, emphasizing a new keyword each time.

Day 4

Each family member reads the verse, pausing at a different word for the others to say from memory.

Day 5

Each family member takes a turn quoting the verse from memory. Ask each member for a specific prayer request to apply this verse.

Pray.

Pray a prayer of thanks, a prayer for the family to walk in the truths of the fighter verse, or a prayer that God would provide an opportunity to use this Scripture to encourage someone.

Sing.

Sing the verse using a song option on the Immanuel Fighter Verse Playlist found on Spotify. You can access the link [here](#), in the bulletin, Connect, or the app.



Family Worship Example // Isaiah 40:8

Read

Day 1

Read the verse in context, including some verses before and/or after the Fighter Verse. Then, solely read the verse. Identify the main idea of the verse.

Read Isaiah 40:6-8. Then read Isaiah 40:8. "The main idea is that God's word will last forever."

Day 2

Define and explain keywords in the Fighter Verse. Play a game of charades using the keywords learned.

Define/Explain grass, withers, flower, fades, word, God, stand, forever. Each family member takes a turn acting out one of the keywords while the others guess.

Day 3

Read the verse, emphasizing a new keyword each time.

The GRASS withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever.

The grass WITHERS, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever.

The grass withers, the FLOWER fades, but the word of our God will stand forever...

Day 4

Each family member reads the verse, pausing at a different word for the others to say from memory.

The grass (pause) "WITHERS", the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever.

The grass withers, the (pause) "FLOWER" fades, but the word of our God will stand forever...

Day 5

Each family member takes a turn quoting the verse from memory. Ask each member for a specific prayer request to apply this verse.

"The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever." I'd like to pray that I will think of God's word when I feel scared about the future.
