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Letter from the Editor

Sireli Paregamner,

In September 2008, I had the unique opportunity to visit Lebanon with my husband Sevan and members of our Saint Sarkis Young Adults Bible Study group. We represented Saint Sarkis at the first annual International Armenian Youth Christian Conference hosted by the Catholicosate of Cilicia in Antelias, Lebanon. The conference took place in Bikfaya, the seat of the Catholicosate in the brutally hot Lebanese summer.

Beirut had always loomed large in my mind as a dangerous place of war and violence but also intrigued me with its rich history and its reputation as the Paris-of-the-Middle-East. Staying in the mountains of Lebanon in the small town of Bikfaya, being immersed in the church, hearing the seminarians' beautiful voices sing Hayr Mer in the carved cha-



pel every morning transported my soul to a deeper understanding and appreciation of our church. I can still smell the sweet bouquets of fresh fruit arranged each day during lunch. I didn't know tomatoes could grow so large and so sweet until our trip to Lebanon! We tried everything from rose-flavored ice cream and kunifeh to grilled cheese served in the wee hours of the night. We spoke with the seminarians, visited the orphanage, toured the ruins of Baalbeck and Byblos, and made a stop in the Armenian city of Bourj-Hamood. Lebanon was a trip for the senses and Bikfaya was a trip for the spirit.

We few had the opportunity, not only to meet and speak with His Holiness Aram I, but to experience his world – to walk on his soil, worship in his churches, and dine with his seminarians. This October, the Vehapar graces us with a visit to the United States. His first stop is New York. What an opportunity to meet Vehapar, experience his wisdom, perspectives, and love of our church and community. I hope you

can join His Holiness on October 6th at Saint Sarkis Church for a special Youth Conference, Church Service, and Reception. What a wonderful opportunity for our congregation to meet the Vehapar and celebrate the vibrancy and span of our Armenian Church.

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Pastor's Message

A letter from our Pastor

Thoughts on Orthodoxy and Renewal

his year the community of St. Sarkis Church marks two auspicious events in a unique and omemorable manner: the upcoming pontifical visit of His Holiness Aram I in October and the 50th Anniversary Celebrations of St. Sarkis Church in November. St. Sarkis hosts a Young Adults Seminar with the theme "Orthodoxy and Renewal" on Saturday October 6, 2012 as part of the pontifical visit. We encourage young adults of the parishes of the Eastern Prelacy to attend the seminar and meet with His Holiness Aram I.

The Theme of Orthodoxy and Renewal

I would like to share with our readers some ideas about the theme of the seminar, Orthodoxy and Renewal. The word orthodox is from Greek orthos ("right", "true", or "straight") and doxa ("opinion" or "belief"). However,

the word doxa gains new meaning from the Septuagint (LXX) – a Greek translation of the Hebrew Scriptures in which scholars rendered the Hebrew word for "glory" as doxa. The New Testament and Orthodox Churches use this new meaning of doxa as "glory" in their church practice.

Orthodoxy therefore, is the way that we perceive the various elements of our faith and the manner through which we express them, not only in worship, but in

life in general. In other words, orthodoxy is our identity – the one that those of the Armenian Orthodox faith strived to forge, maintain and enrich throughout the centuries. Yet the core issue here is how much of our Orthodox identity is relevant in the world in which we live?

The Double Crisis of Identity and Relevance

Identity and relevance - a double crisis, as described by a German theologian: "...these two crises are complementary. The more theology and the church attempt to become relevant to the problems of the present day, the more deeply they are drawn into the crisis of their identity in traditional dogmas, rights and moral notions, the more irrelevant and unbelievable they become" (Moltmann, Jürgen. The Crucified God: the Cross of Christ as the Foundation and Criticism of Christian Theology. Minneapolis: Fortress, 1993. Print. p7). The Armenian Church, like all other churches, faces this dilemma. Some members of the church want "modernization" of the Armenian Church: shorter Sunday services spoken in modern Armenian or English instead of classical Armenian. But this form of modernization will not make the church more relevant because it is not *renewal*.

A Holistic Approach to Renewal

Renewal of the Armenian Church is an introspective process. It starts when we fully embrace our Armenian Orthodox identity and find out who we really are. Active participation is the pre-requisite for that process. Re-

> newal of the Armenian Church requires "a holistic and integrated approach" as suggests His Holiness Aram I in his "Towards a Renewed Armenian Church" article. In his article, His Holiness provides a sound framework for reforming the Armenian Church (Aram, I. The Armenian Church Beyond The 1700th Anniversary. Antelias: the Armenian Catholicosate of Cilicia, 2002. Print. p22). His Holiness considers integration of modern Armenian and English or French into certain parts of church services, revising the

liturgy and encouraging the participation of lay people, strengthening our parishes by creating youth ministries and providing social service.

It is never too late to learn about our identity and make the journey back home to our Holy Mother Church. I take this opportunity to invite our readers to make a conscious decision to rediscover their Armenian Orthodox Identity. The Seminar in October could be the first expression of your decision to explore the riches of your identity.



40th Anniversary of the Ordination of Bishop Anoushavan Tanielian

Hundreds celebrated the 40th anniversary of the ordination of Bishop Anoushavan Tanielian, Vicar Gen-

eral of the Eastern Prelacy on Sunday, March 25, 2012. Reservations for the banquet Sunday afternoon quickly sold out, an early sign of the outpouring of appreciation Bishop Anoushavan would receive at the event for his years of service to the faithful of the Eastern Prelacy. The Bishop served the church since 1984 when he came to the United States to study at Princeton Theological Seminary.

The day began with a memorable and captivating service at St. Sarkis Church in Douglaston, New York, where Bishop Anoushavan served as pastor for 14 years from 1991 to 2005. With Archbishop Oshagan presiding, the Divine Liturgy was celebrated by Bishop Anoushavan.

In the middle of the service, a special Pontifical Message from His Holiness Aram I, Catholicos

of the Great House of Cilicia, was carried in a procession by Rev. Fr. Nareg Terterian, pastor of St. Sarkis Church, as the choir sang Ourakh Ler (Rejoice, O Holy Church), and taken to the altar where the message was read by the Prelate.

Thoughts on the Lecture by Dr. JoAnn Heaney-Hunter

Our St. Sarkis Friday night Lenten lecture on March 23rd truly took us to a higher level with lecturer Professor JoAnn Heaney-Hunter, Ph.D. and LMHC from St. John's University. She spoke on the topic of "Dying to self and rising in Christ through forgiveness in our daily life." From the Gospel of St. John we are informed that if we forgive the sin, we are in turn forgiven. We each do have those powers. Through God's Grace, we are forgiven unconditionally; of course this is not a wild carte-blanche without repercussions or consequences as there is, at the end of the road, Justice. Without a relationship with Christ, we certainly feel that we are separated from him and we do not have the capacity to quite make the mark ("Great Sinner that I am").

We have all experienced anger with someone or some painful event. It is very difficult to let go of the pain and resentment even when we are right. How do we move beyond? In boxing or wrestling, opponents badmouth each other, a bit for advertising, but also to get the opponent so mad that he will not think clearly and make mistakes. When we are full of anger and hate, we victims become captives of the enemy simply because we are at less than 100% effectiveness. Just like dur-

ing Lent, we empty ourselves of certain foods, this together with prayer becomes an opportunity for the Holy Spirit to strengthen us.

The wisdom of the Bible gives us Forgiveness. All Armenians Apostolics and other Christians are familiar with the prayer line "and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone who



is indebted to us." Forgiveness is what we get through Grace and God expects us in turn to reciprocate by looking beyond with Reconciliation. Consequently, like the cross, this process takes on a holy-vertical as well as human-horizontal dimension to make our human interpersonal relationships right again. Let go of anger, forgive, make right, and encourage each other. Don't stay wise in your own eyes.

It is extremely difficult to die to our self-centeredness, our pride, our ego, and celebrate a new life. Our entire life is full of annoyances, troubles, and barriers. We can choose to fight these battles and sacrifice the quality of our lives and our relationship with God or we can choose to fight the truly righteous ones as Christ did with a holy alliance and learn how to move forward as a victor. Don't be a doormat; stand up to evil but live by a clear standard of morality.

Besides love, family life for couples requires awareness, work, caring, forgiveness and reconciliation for no one is perfect and we need to realize that we are all worksin-progress. Sometimes our bodies will betray us. Sometimes we can let go of the pain but the reconciliation is unrealizable. Remember, we can only change ourselves. The unreconciled person should be left to God and his justice will be unavoidable. Christians are to follow the steps of Jesus Christ and God will raise us to a new life!

Holy Week at St. Sarkis Church

Fr. Nareg Terterian celebrated the Divine Liturgy and delivered a sermon on the events of Palm Sunday from the Gospel passage of the day (Matthew 20.29-21.17). He said: "For us to fully understand the mystery of our faith, we need the heeling touch of Christ. Just like the two blind beggars needed restoration of their sight, we also need restoration of our spiritual sight to better perceive the presence of God in our life. And as Jesus drove merchants and money exchangers out of the Temple of Jerusalem, let us also ask him to cleanse our souls. The house of God is a house of prayer and our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit".

The Mass was followed by the service of "Trunpatzek" (opening of the portal ceremony) marking the end of 40 days of Lent and the beginning of Holy Week with the Palm Sunday procession.

Church services for the Holy Week continued on Tuesday April 3rd, 2012 with the Traditional Evening Service of the Ten Bridesmaids, a reenactment of the parable told by Jesus in Mathew 25:14-30 instilling the need for worshipers to be prepared. Students from St. Sarkis Church Saturday School participated in the service.





On Thursday evening, the Liturgy of the Holy Eucharist (commemorating the Last Supper of the Lord Jesus Christ) was followed by the "Washing of the Feet" service, a direct observance of the Lord's command (John 13: 1-17) and a sign of humility. Fr. Nareg washed the feet of the church servers and anointed them with oil.

The Tenebrae service followed the Washing of the Feet presided by His Eminence Archbishop Oshagan, the Prelate of the Eastern United States. During the Tenebrae service, each candle and light in the Church are gradually extinguished while psalms are read and hymns are chanted until the parishioners and clergy are in total darkness commemorating the betraval by Judas, Jesus' arrest and judgment. The services on Thursday stretch late into the night marking the vigil from Maundy Thursday to Good Friday when Jesus Christ did not sleep. If you have never experienced the Tenebrae, you are missing a powerful part of Holy Week.

On Good Friday, Der Nareg led the service of the Burial in front of the symbolic tomb of Jesus decorated by flowers brought by our parishioners. On Holy Saturday morning, the

St. Sarkis Church from the Beginning...a Conversation with Arpi Bekian

On a sunny day in June, I spent a lovely afternoon sipping tea and reminiscing about the origins of Saint Sarkis Church with Mrs. Arpi Bekian - a true daughter of the Church. For those of you who do not know her, Arpi's father Der Asoghik Kelejian served as St. Sarkis' first Der Hayr, making Arpi and her family an integral part of the church from the very beginning. Arpi, just back from a pilgrimage to Jerusalem, was in the midst of preparing for the upcoming wedding of her youngest son Adam. She has the glow of someone comfortable in her life and in her faith. I asked her to share some of her thoughts on Saint Sarkis Church from the beginning.

The Early Years

Fifty years ago, a small group of American Armenians founded Saint Sarkis Church in Bayside, New York and named Arpi's father, Der Asoghik Kelejian, its first pastor. Der Asoghik embraced his role as father of St. Sarkis for the next 39 years with pride, humanity, and love. Through weekly Sunday services, happy weddings and



christenings, and sad memorials and hospital visits, Arpi admired her dad's spirituality, his kindness, his refusal to accept that someone could do evil. He loved everyone. Truly a turn-the-other-cheek type of

the church is not just a building but a community and that her father and mother worked tirelessly to take care of all in the congregation.



man. Of course, being the family of a Der Hayr means the whole family serves the church. As Yeretzkin, her mother Anjel was also devoted to the church and its members. She remembers her mother losing sleep praying for a parishioner who had taken ill until the woman returned home from the hospital. She asked her mother if she knew the woman well and her mother replied "no" but that she was "one of our own". Arpi and her sister Ani were also involved in the church. Her father would recruit the girls to help out in reading the scriptures during the High Holy Days - when a more traditional male volunteer wasn't available. As a child she often wondered why she had to share her father and mother with "all these people during Christmases, Easters, and Thanksgivings" but years later realized that

As a child of the church, Arpi remembers the ebb and flow of the church week - Saturdays at Saturday School, Sundays at Sunday School and Badarak and exploring the old church between services. The church was more familiar to Arpi than her own home and the congregation, a second family. She remembers a favorite hiding place behind the performance stage where she could escape and explore. Those were beautiful times for her with so many memories, so many characters. She remembered all of the people who came to the church and her home - like the Three Sisters who had survived the German concentration camps. the Golden Girls who made mass for the church, the Ladies Guild who prepared meals for the congregation. She remembered her great anticipation of the fall festivals and

Bazaars at the church where people would dress up and buy silver and gold and buy raffle tickets hoping to win a trip to Paris or room-sized carpet donated to the church. She remembered the first version of this very newsletter, The Shoghagat as a labor of love for Der Asoghik -- a monthly newsletter he printed by hand to keep the community up to date on the news of the church. She also shared a story of seeing the play "The 70 Year Old Bridegroom" at the old church and the reception following the performance where she met all of the Romanian-Armenian performers including a handsome man named Edward, who would become her husband.

Tragedy Strikes

There were sad memories as well. Arpi recalls returning from a weekend away with her husband, turning on the television and seeing the horrific images of the fire on the evening news. She called her parents immediately to let her father know but her mother told her

that he was already at the church offering whatever help he could. Those were difficult years for the church.

Survival, Rebirth & Renewal

Arpi says St. Sarkis Church was like a "Phoenix rising from the ashes to spread its wings

once again", finding the strength and resources to rebuild the sanctuary and scattered congregation. That St. Sarkis survives and thrives in its new home in Douglaston, New York would be a great joy to her father Arpi said. She thinks her father would be proud of the growing community of St. Sarkis today, 50 years after that first Badarak in 1962. He would be happy that



the fire did not kill the spirit of the church. He would be proud of the resiliency of the church and the community. As a recent member of the St. Sarkis family I was happy to hear the beginnings of

this vibrant parish and am so grateful that Arpi opened her heart and shared her memories of St. Sarkis through the years for us all to enjoy.






