1. Auction Chair resolves all disputes.
2. Auction Chair opens and closes the Live Auction.
3. **Sociables:** *Sign up from 7:00 p.m. - 8:15 p.m.* for Sociable events. Cost is on a per person basis. Sociables close out when the host's limit is reached. Please print your name clearly.
4. **Wine Pull:** Participants may purchase *one cork pull for \$20*. The number on the cork corresponds to a bottle of wine.
5. **Silent Auction:** Bids must be accompanied by the bidder's name. Last highest bid on the bid sheet at the *close of the auction at 8:15 p.m.* will be the buyer of the item.
6. **Live Auction:** The winning bid and bidder will be identified by the auctioneer(s) after each item in the live auction. The winning bidder will receive a confirmation at that time.
7. Payment by the successful bidder(s) must be made in full at the end of the evening by cash, check, or credit card unless other arrangements are made with the Auction Chair. Checks should be made payable to Christ the King Lutheran Church. Cash and credit cards are also accepted.
8. The Auction committee has endeavored to catalog and describe the donated items correctly. All items are sold "*as is.*" We are not able to provide tax value documentation.
9. *All sales are final.* No exchanges or refunds. Auction items are not refundable for cash.
10. Items must be removed at the end of the Auction unless other arrangements are made with the Auction Chair.
11. **Quilt Raffle:** One ticket will be drawn and winner's name announced. Winner does not have to be present to win. Delivery can be arranged.

Each month, the winner will receive a carefully curated, gourmet dessert from Chef Catherine Rodriguez. ## **LA 4 - Model of an 18th Century Sailing Vessel**

The winner of this stunning handmade model of a two masted square-rigged ship which makes it a "brig" will have naming rights. This model is the same class of vessel as the CTK church ship "Superb" that hangs in the Nave. The estimated date of the modeled ship is 1795. The hull of the model is double planked on bulkhead construction at a scale of 1/8 per ft. or 1/96. The length of the ship's hull was 90 ft. with a beam of 24 ½ ft. The displacement was 235 tons.

The model is sitting on a custom-made, museum-quality "African mahogany," base commonly known as sapele created by the modeler's brother in Santa Cruz, California. It also has a custom made acrylic top made by a local craftsman.

The base is 12½"x 23½"x 22¾" tall.
