

We have a great lineup for this year's Advent Allegro concert series.


December 4: "The Extension Chords" (with Jean Welch)



#### JACKSONVILLE FOOD CENTER

Christmas is near, and it is time to think about giving ... to those who have little and need help. Our Food Center traditionally prepares over 300 Holiday Food Baskets, containing items for the celebration. Items needed are listed on paper that can be found on the coffee area counter or on the poster in the coat room. Money donations are also much appreciated.

Several articles in our newspaper have highlighted help received from several sources at the Food Center recently, among them a give-away of 125 turkeys. Distribution began at 9:00am. With lots of help, by 9:15, only a dozen turkeys remained. At another time, a truckload of food from DOT Foods was delivered to our Food Center and highlighted on the front page of the Journal Courier. It was much needed and appreciated.

In October, 650 families were served for food orders, a total of 1,404 people at a cost of \$68,358.80, equally 48,916.60 pounds. 402 families were served for bakery, a total of 711 people at a cost of \$6,575, equally 8,040 pounds. The churches contributed \$8,644.61 in money and \$1,842.50 in food donations. Our Faith Lutheran Church donated \$190 in October and \$100 in food in November. Let us be more generous in days to come.
