

Welcome!

I am delighted to have you with us today for this service of worship. Please, stay awhile. Get to know us better. No matter who you are, or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here.

We at the Cathedral Church of All Saints, are a diverse lot, from many Christian backgrounds, non-Christian backgrounds, and no faith backgrounds. We come for Christian community, to find God in relationships with neighbours and new friends. We come for lessons from the incredible life of Jesus Christ. We come for spiritual rest, time to think, pray, and center on God, for comfort in hard times, and gratitude in good times. We come to serve God, each other, and the world. We're not perfect. Whether you have been attending the Cathedral Church your whole life or this is your first time here, you are invited to participate in the service as fully as you feel comfortable doing and are able to.

Welcome/Announcements

Territorial Acknowledgement

Presider: We begin by acknowledging that we are in Mi'kma'ki, the ancestral and unceded territory of the Mi'kmaq People. This territory is covered by the "Treaties of Peace and Friendship" which Mi'kmaq and Wolastoqiyik (Maliseet) People first signed with the British Crown in 1725. The treaties did not deal with surrender of lands and resources but in fact recognized Mi'kmaq and Wolastoqiyik (Maliseet) title and established the rules for what was to be an ongoing relationship between nations.

People: We give thanks for this land and all those who have been stewards of it; for their stories and for their lives – past, present, and future. We commit ourselves to prayerfully seek reconciliation, justice, and healing that we might listen and learn to be faithful stewards of this good land and live in right relationship. Teach us that waiting is not lost time but a liminal time within which new possibilities and patterns take form.

All: Teach us that waiting is not inactive time but a quickening time from which new life and love emerges.

Leader: Emmanuel, God with us in all time, as we look for your coming All: Teach us how to inhabit this waiting time.

Homily

A silence for reflection may follow.

Affirmation of Belief Affirming the Church's Mission - (from the Iona Community)

Leader: That we worship one God; Creator, Redeemer, and Holy Spirit, in whose image we are made, to whose service we are summoned, by whose presence we are renewed:

All: This we believe.

Leader: That it is central to the mission of Christ that we participate through word and action to rejoice in the diversity of human culture, to preserve the earth in all its beauty and frailty, to witness to the love of God for every person, and to invite all to share in that converting experience:

All: This we believe.

Leader: That through the power of the Holy Spirit, the persecuted shall be lifted up and the wicked will fall, the heartfelt prayers and hidden actions of God's people shall change for good the course of human history, the ancient words of scripture shall continue to startle us with fresh insight:

All: This we believe.

Leader: That God has called the Church into being to be the servant of the kingdom, to be a sign of God's new order, to celebrate in every land worship which raises our hearts to heaven:

All: This we believe.

Leader: That Christ, fully aware of our differences, prays that we may be one so that the world may believe:

All: This we believe and to this we are committed, for the love of God, in the way of Christ, by the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen

The Prayers of the People

Confession and Absolution

Leader Emmanuel -

through your Incarnation you have shown us what it is to live imaginatively, love expansively, and act creatively.

All We confess that sometimes we have waited without thought and so have stifled fruitful possibility... silence/kyrie

Leader Emmanuel -

we confess that sometimes we have waited without generosity and so have constricted fruitful connection ... silence/kyrie

Leader Emmanuel -

we confess that sometimes we have waited without hope and so have limited fruitful action ... silence/kyrie

Leader Emmanuel -

we confess that sometimes we have simply been too busy or too distracted to wait, and so have missed your moment ... silence/kyrie

Leader Emmanuel -

we look once more for you, forgive the poverty of our waiting, touch our dreaming, stretch our living and energize our acting, that we may be ready for your coming. silence/kyrie

Presider: For all to whom regret is real,

who seek renewal, God forgives you, Christ renews you

and the Holy Spirit enables you to grow in love.

People: Amen.

The Peace

All stand, and the presiding celebrant addresses the people.

May the peace of Emmanuel, the dynamic peace of imaginative dreaming, the challenging peace of radical loving, the powerful peace of engaged action, fill you to overflowing in this season of waiting.

The peace of the Lord be always with you. *People* And also with you.

The Celebration of the Eucharist

Presider: This is the table of Emmanuel – a place where bread and wine remind us how to live and love as those who inhabit God's time, and work to build His Kingdom. A place where we recognize that the one for whom we wait is also the one who is already, and always, here with us.

So come.

whether you are watching for the dawn, or dreading first light, whether you are waiting with hope, or hiding your face, come with quiet confidence because here it is Emmanuel who watches for our coming, and who waits with love and joy to welcome us in.

The Prayer over the Gifts

All God of abundance, we bring before you the precious fruits of your creation, and with them our very lives.

Teach us patience and hope as we care for all those in need until the coming of your Son, our Saviour and Lord. Amen.

The Great Thanksgiving

Presider: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you

Presider: Lift up your hearts

People: We lift them up to God.
Presider: Let us give thanks to God.

People: It is right to give both thanks and praise.

Presider: The story of Emmanuel

is the story of God waiting to inhabit time, who took on flesh and form. and lived among us, so that we might re-imagine life. It is the story of Jesus – waiting to be betrayed, who shared supper with his friends blessing and breaking bread (bread is broken) and pouring and sharing wine (wine is poured) so that we might re-imagine love. It is the story of Christ – waiting in the tomb for God's moment, who threw down the gates of hell and drew away the sting of death so that we might re-imagine the world. It is the story of one

who knows what it is to wait, and who shows us what it is to wait well.

And so, taking this bread and wine, we remember and celebrate the waiting which began to change the world; and we join our voices with all who still wait and work for that change to come to completion:

All: Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of Love and Light,
heaven and earth are full of your Light
Glory to You, our God.
Blessed is He, blessed are we,
blessed are all who come
to your Light.
Glory to You, our God.

And as we follow the example of Jesus send down now, your Holy Spirit on us, and on these gifts of bread and wine, that as they are transformed into the body and blood of Christ, so too may we be transformed that we may find the imagination, the courage, and the strength to use our waiting times to build God's Kingdom of joy, justice, and peace.

People Amen.

Presdier And now, as our Saviour Christ has taught us,

we are bold to say,

All Our Father, who art in heaven,

hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done,

on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses,

as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Breaking of the Bread

The presider breaks the consecrated bread for distribution

Presider: Look, the body of Christ is broken

for the life of the world.

All: Here is Christ coming to us in bread and wine.

The Communion

The presider invites the people to share in communion and may say,

Presider The gifts of God for the People of God.

All Thanks be to God.

We invite you to form a circle around the font. Please take a cup from the table by the altar to receive the wine of the Eucharist, you may leave the cup in the tray as you return to your seat. You are also welcome

to join the circle for a prayer of blessing should you choose not to receive. We are happy to come to you at your seat should you desire.

Prayer after Communion

Presider: The earth still waits for its healing ...

All: May we who are part of that waiting take and use the dreaming times to re-imagine the world; inhabit and use the liminal times to discover the patterns of God; embrace and use the quickening times to learn how to live and love; so may our watching and waiting

join with that of Emmanuel to realize God's Kingdom here on earth.

The Blessing:

Presider: Now go in peace, do what God wills, follow where Christ calls, pray for the gifts of the Spirit; and the blessing of God the Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer rest on, and remain with you, now and always. **Amen.**
