Dec. 9-14/ Day 1: Read Luke 1:5-25:

Q. Think of a time when you found it difficult to trust in God's promises. How did you come to rest more fully in His promises?

Dec. 9-14/Day 2: Read Luke 1:26-38:

Q. Compare the response of Mary to that of Zacharias in verse 5-25. What similarities or differences do you see?

Q. To whom do you most closely relate in responding to God's message for your life – Mary or Zacharias? Why?

Dec. 9-14/Day 3: Read Luke 1:39-56: Q. In v. 41, Elizabeth is filled w/ the Holy Spirit. How can we slow down & listen for the Spirit's guidance in our lives?

Q. What are you trusting in God to provide? Why? How are you praying to God as part of this trusting?

Dec. 9-14/Day 4: Read Luke 1:57-80: Q. What truths about salvation are emphasized in this passage?

Q. How can you acknowledge God's salvation plan in your life? What is it like to share that knowledge w/ others?

<u>Dec. 9-14/Day 5: Read Matthew 1:18-25:</u> **Q.** How do we go about recognizing God's direction, even when it seems to make little sense?

Dec. 9-14/ Day 1: Read Luke 1:5-25:

Q. Think of a time when you found it difficult to trust in God's promises. How did you come to rest more fully in Hispromises?[Remembering what He has done in the past. Realizing that worry is not going to change the situation.]

Q. How do our doubts about God's promises impact your witness to others?

[It gets our mind off of Him, or off on what He WILL do... and onto our current situation.]

Dec. 9-14/Day 2: Read Luke 1:26-38:

Q. Compare the response of Mary to that of Zacharias in verse 5-25. What similarities or differences do you see? [They both questioned the angel, but Zechariah focused on words/mind of whether he could believe – "how will I know this?". Mary's question focused more on reality of being a virgin, but still praised God for His plan.]

Q. To whom do you most closely relate in responding to God's message for your life – Mary or Zacharias? Why? [Mary. I do tend to be a pretty trusting person; but I still wonder & question God's plans when I'm not sure]

Dec. 9-14/Day 3: Read Luke 1:39-56:

Q. In v. 41, Elizabeth is filled w/ the Holy Spirit. How can we slow down & listen for the Spirit's guidance in our lives? [Close our eyes, turn off the technology, think about what just happened in the last 48 hours concentrating on what happened that you didn't have an impact or answer for.]

Q. What are you trusting in God to provide? Why? How are you praying to God as part of this trusting? [Time, resources, good weather, can't do it alone. Praying, I trust God first before changing the situation.]

Dec. 9-14/Day 4: Read Luke 1:57-80:

Q. What truths about salvation are emphasized in this passage?

[Deliverance from enemy (74); holiness/righteousness (75); knowledge (77); forgiveness (77); mercy (78)]

Q. How can you acknowledge God's salvation plan in your life? What is it like to share that knowledge w/ others? [Thank Him. Live it out. It is our mission to share it. Share your life, experiences, & life change.]

Dec. 9-14/Day 5: Read Matthew 1:18-25:

Q. How do we go about recognizing God's direction, even when it seems to make little sense? ["consider" the things of God. To consider means that you have a partial or full understanding of God from His word.]

Q. Sometimes God's provisioning or answers to prayer seem to create chaos. How do we go about serving the will of God even when it seems to not make sense? [Remember things of the past which were similar that God answered us]

Dec. 9-14/Day 6: Study and Meditation on God's Word: Q. Compare the birth stories in Luke and Matthew. Why the difference in the texts between the two authors? [Their background. What they already knew and who their audience was.]

Q. How can we extend our daily trust in God through life's troubling circumstances? [Be thankful. Remember the past.]

Q. When you read the story of the birth of Christ, what is your initial response?

[Thankfulness.]
